President's Message



Aloha ODKF Supporters,
Thank you for taking time to review the 2012-13 Outrigger Duke Kahanamoku Foundation's ("ODKF") annual report. Your support has allowed ODKF to advance its mission of assisting

Hawai'i's student-athletes and nonprofit organizations, promoting water sports events, recognizing Hawai'i's waterman legacy, and, most importantly, honoring the memory of Duke Kahanamoku.

ODKF contributed over \$300,000 to scholarship and grant recipients in Hawai'i in the past two years. In the last several years ODKF has become crucial to funding the future of those who share our commitment to water sports in Hawai'i.

ODKF's success starts with you, our donors and supporters. Your support assures ODKF's continuing influence on the young kama'aina of Hawai'i. Our pool of scholarship and grant recipients represents a broad cross-section of the community. Applicants come from all islands and comprise a wide range of ethnic, cultural, and economic groups. They attend public, private and home schools and are a true representation of our state's diversity.

They also share a commonality in being focused, driven achievers who stand out amongst their peers by succeeding in the classroom and in their chosen sport (and often in multiple sports), and being leaders of their teams and classes. Importantly, despite the time commitments inherent in sports and schoolwork they are involved in their community as well

In addition to providing financial assistance, ODKF continues to promote and make strides in two key programs important to our water sports community: Duke's OceanFest and the Hawai'i Waterman Hall of Fame.

Duke's OceanFest occurs annually during the week of Duke's birthday anniversary on August 24. A subsidiary of ODKF, the

OceanFest Board organizes Waikiki's premier ocean sports event. Duke's OceanFest is attracting local, national, and international attention. Through strategic partnerships with local and international sponsors and race promoters we expect the nine day festival to increase in both participation and sponsorships in the next few years. As such, we are hopeful it will become another source of scholarship and grant revenue.

On August 22nd, the Hawai'i Waterman Hall of Fame inducted its fourth class of honorees. An overflow crowd at the Outrigger Canoe Club heard heartfelt appreciation from the inductees. I was incredibly proud of the event's quality and overwhelmingly positive feedback from the honorees and community members. The Waterman Hall of Fame Awards Dinner is taking its place as the signature event for Hawai'i's water sports community.

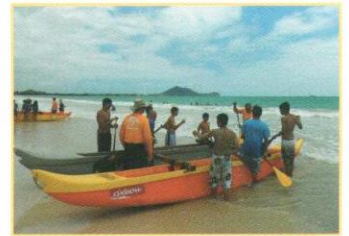

DONORS & STUDENT ATHLETES HELP PERPETUATE THE "DUKE SPORTS"

Our annual Mahalo Luncheon on June 17th brought together some of ODKF's major donors with many of the scholarship and grant recipients. This luncheon is an opportunity for donors to meet those whose lives they impact through their generosity. In addition, the student-athletes who benefit through the grants and scholarships are able to thank the donors and realize that there are people in the community who think perpetuating the "Duke Sports" is important enough to give both their time and money to the cause.

As a result of our generous and loyal donors, ODKF was able to present \$150,000 in scholarships and grants to 72 outstanding Hawai'i scholar-athletes and non-profit organizations competing in water sports and volleyball. Forty-eight outstanding scholar-athletes received \$110,000 in college scholarships for the upcoming school year. A total of \$40,000 in athletic grants went to 24 awardees, comprised of Hawai'i athletes competing in water sports and volleyball events, and nonprofit organizations providing water sports and youth development programs in Hawai'i.

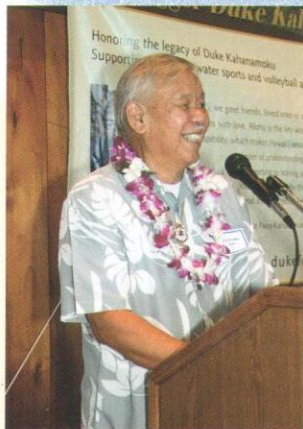

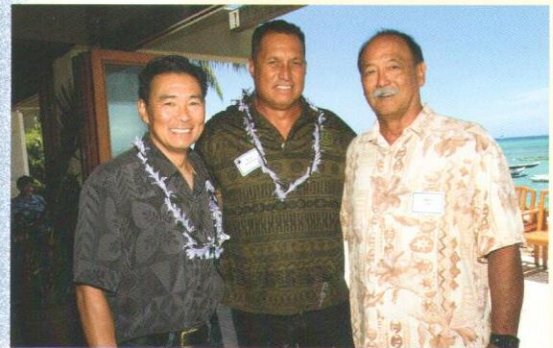

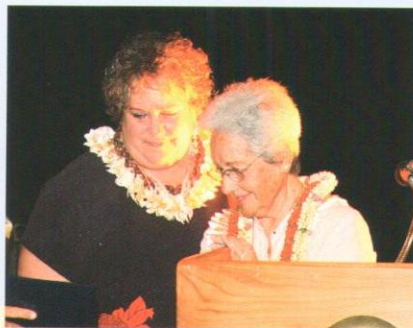

Bill Smith – Olympic swimming gold medalist and pioneering water safety director

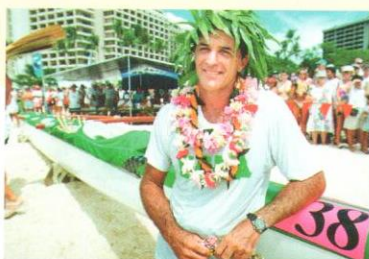
China Uemura – Longboard surfing champion and devoted youth, community supporter

DUKE'S OCEANFEST

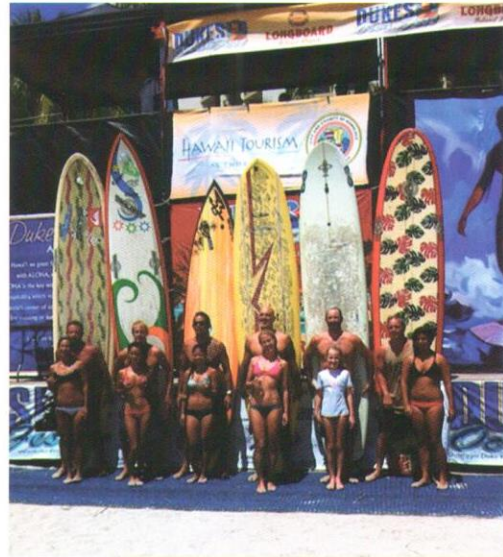
Duke Kahanamoku's legacy was once again honored with the 12th Annual Duke's OceanFest taking place August 17-25, 2013.

The nine-day event featured a variety of ocean sports with Waikiki Beach as the magnificent backdrop. Some events, such as Longboard Surfing, Swimming, Tandem Surfing, Surf Polo and Beach Volleyball were close to Duke Kahanamoku's heart! Other, newer events, such as Stand Up Paddeboarding and the Lifeguard Competition are ones Duke certainly would have enjoyed.

A record number of competitors participated in the Duke's Ocean Mile on Saturday, August 24th. Four hundred and thirty four swimmers finished the course, including the 2013 Ambassador of Aloha recipient, Kira Fox!

THE PURPOSE

of the Outrigger Duke Kahanamoku Foundation is to financially support the development of individuals and organizations that perpetuate the spirit and legacy of Duke Kahanamoku. • ODKF accomplishes this by encouraging athletes and scholars whose endeavors will contribute to the growth and development of athletics in Hawai'i; supporting athletic events and participation by teams and individuals in local, national and international competition; supporting individuals in furthering their education; and assisting in preserving, perpetuating and developing sports which have a special cultural or historical significance to Hawai'i.

DESIGNATED FUNDS

There are fifteen ODKF Board Designated Funds. ODKF awards grants to athletes, teams, scholar-athletes and sporting events in the name of these funds. We thank the families and friends who have made these grants possible.

Muriel Macfarlane Flanders Fund: Established by Muriel Flanders to support water sports in Hawai'i, to perpetuate the Macfarlane Fourth of July Regatta and to honor the accomplishments of Duke Paoa Kahanamoku. Through this Fund this gracious lady's legacy will surely endure.

Terrence McCarthy Fund: Established by Terrence McCarthy in memory of her husband Edmond McCarthy, who firmly believed in the combination of athletics and education. Mrs. McCarthy honored her husband by supporting Hawai'i's top scholar athletes.

Tom "Daddy" Haine Fund: Established in 1994, funds support the sport of volleyball in Hawai'i. Haine was the captain of the 1968 U.S. Olympic men's volleyball team. He was an 18-time USVBA All-American and in 1991 was inducted into the U. S. Volleyball Hall of Fame. He was a member of the original Outrigger Foundation that later merged with the Duke Kahanamoku Foundation to form ODKF.

Kala Kukea Fund: Established in 1996 and named for one of Hawai'i's top overall water sportsmen. Kukea touched the lives of many young athletes in his short 52 years on earth. He was an outstanding competitor, coach and role model. In 1996 he posthumously received the Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association John DeRego Perpetual trophy for service to the Association and to the Molokai-Oahu canoe race.

Cline Mann Fund: Named for John Cline Mann, a superb water sportsman who died in 1996. He was captain of his Dartmouth College swimming team, an avid small boat sailor, and a

strong promoter of paddleboard racing. Grants from this fund help to support the annual Cline Mann Paddleboard Race. Cline Mann was also a member of the original Board of Directors of the Duke Kahanamoku Foundation (DKF) that was founded in 1963. He played an instrumental role in the merger of DKF and the Outrigger Foundation to create the present Outrigger Duke Kahanamoku Foundation (ODKF).

Thomas M. Arnott Fund: Established by Marian Arnott in loving memory of her husband who was a great supporter of both OCC and ODKF. Tommy Arnott, a masterful surfer, was also recognized for competing in canoe races with Duke Kahanamoku. As teammates they beat all their competition in the early 1940's. Consequently this fund supports interscholastic canoe paddling in Hawai'i.

Henry Ayau Fund: Established in memory of this renowned athlete and his legacy. A "Moloka'i Boy," Henry excelled in life as a businessman, sportsman and community servant. An exceptional athlete, Henry was a noted baseball player, surfer, canoe paddler, and world-class free diver. Many viewed him as a modern day "Ambassador of Aloha."

Kirk Smith Fund: Established in 2007 in memory of Kirk Smith who came to Hawai'i to catch waves and caught an enduring love of the Islands. He created the Hawaiian Airlines Duke's Legends Surf Classic as part of Duke's OceanFest. Without his energy and passion it would not be the great event that it is today. His family and friends knew how important it was for Kirk to support water sports and the young scholar athletes of Hawai'i and, thus, created this special fund in his name.

Rand Booth Carlson Fund: Randy Carlson loved Hawai'i, the ocean, and traveling to exotic places but most of all, teaching young people. An artist by nature, poet in spirit, and voyager to

the core, "Mr. C" inspired his students to explore and embrace the wonders of the world surrounding them. He was also an accomplished canoe paddler whose grandfather competed with Duke Kahanamoku in the 1932 Olympics. Randy's family established this fund to perpetuate his legacy of motivating young people to achieve, love life, and forever learn.

David & Keanuenue Rochlen Fund: Established in 2010 in their loving memory to perpetuate Hawaiian water sports and encourage young athletes as they did in life. Dave, an accomplished waterman, lifeguard, stuntman and philosopher, forever influenced beach culture with creative, colorful beach and resort wear, delivering the message to embrace Color, Freedom, Difference and Love. Keanuenue was also a water woman and athlete in her own right, recognized by the Outrigger Canoe Club with a Winged "O" for her outstanding achievements in surfing, paddling, beach volleyball, tennis, golf and softball. All the while, they raised their family to enjoy the ocean and respect their island roots. Dave and Keanuenue enthusiastically embraced island life, gave freely, and both loved to share with their friends and ohana.

Title Guaranty Fund: Title Guaranty established this fund to support the Ambassador of Aloha scholarship. As Hawai'i's oldest and largest escrow and title Company, Title Guaranty is committed to promoting and protecting the same values embodied by Duke's creed. This fund to support ODKF's signature scholarship reflects Title Guaranty's belief in Hawai'i's future leaders.

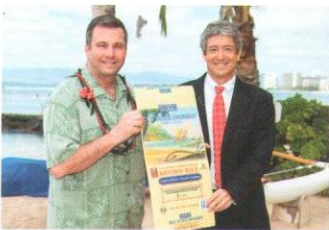
Dale P. Madden and The Madden Corporation Fund: Dale P. Madden, President and CEO of The Madden Corporation and Island Heritage established the CHANGE Fund in 1987. The CHANGE (Changing Hawai'i and

Nurturing Growth & Education) Fund has been providing scholarships to Hawai'i's youth since its inception. Dale has been a supporter of OceanFest and ODKF for a number of years, and as a young boy, had an opportunity to work with Duke Kahanamoku, on the beach at Waikiki, for three days on an episode of "You Asked For It!"

Hawai'i Olympians Fund: Starting with Duke Kahanamoku, Hawai'i has built a proud and sterling record of athletic excellence in the Olympics over the past century. To help perpetuate this legacy, ODKF created this special fund to provide the community with a vehicle to support Hawai'i's elite athletes in their quest to make the U.S. Olympic team in swimming, water polo, kayaking, or volleyball. To qualify for funding, prospective Hawai'i Olympians must meet criteria that include showing proof of national or world ranking, as well as financial need. The community is invited to donate to this fund.

Great Aloha Run Community Fund: Established in 2012 by Carole Kai Charities, the Great Aloha Run embodies the community spirit. It is a fun run put on for the people of Hawai'i by the people of Hawai'i. Relying mainly on volunteer support and local sponsorship, the Great Aloha Run focuses on attracting local participants, using local businesses to supply the run and donates the proceeds of the run to local Hawai'i charities. This fund was created to support scholarships for students exemplifying the volunteerism and community spirit of the Great Aloha Run.

Schwinn Family Fund: Established in 2013 in memory of my family and friends. To perpetuate Hawaiian Water Sports and to encourage athletes and scholars who contribute to the growth and development of athletics in Hawai'i.

The financial statements for the Outrigger Duke Kahanamoku Foundation for the fiscal years ending 2012 and 2011 were audited by CW Associates. These financial statements are available to our members by request.

A report has been developed for the foundation's unaudited financial results for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2013. These financial statements are now being audited. When that audit is completed it will be available to members by request.

Effective June 30, 2012, the fiscal year for ODKF was changed to July 1 through June 30. The fiscal year

change caused two Mahalo Luncheons to fall into one fiscal year. That, and a turnover in staff, added to this year's administrative costs. Costs are expected to return to prior levels for the fiscal year ending 2014.

Foundation contributions are generally unrestricted. Additional funds are raised through activities connected to the Duke's OceanFest, the Hawai'i Waterman Hall of Fame Awards and royalty payments from TS Enterprises (Duke's Restaurant) and Malama Pono.

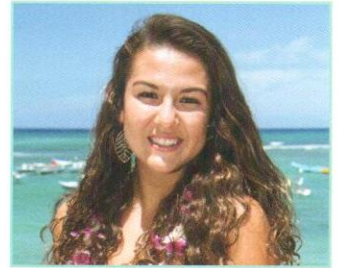

ODKF ATHLETIC GRANTS AND SCHOLARSHIPS

There are three types of grants made by the Foundation: athletic grants for teams and individuals, event grants and scholarships. Athletic and event grants are directed towards specific purposes such as upcoming tournaments or competitions. These grants may be awarded to an individual, team or event. **Individual and Team athletic grant applications are awarded one time per year with a deadline of February 15th.** Event grants have a deadline of September 15th for events occurring in the following fiscal year. The purpose of these grants is to sponsor, promote and encourage amateur participants in state, national and international competition in the sports of canoeing, surfing, kayaking, swimming, water polo and volleyball. Scholarship grants are given to athletes who participate in the same sports as athletic grantees and additionally are in need of assistance in pursuing post high school education. **Scholarship applications are accepted from January 1 to March 1 of each year.**

All grants and scholarship applicants must be residents of Hawai'i and participate in the "Duke Sports." For complete requirements or to apply, go to www.dukefoundation.org.
