President's Message

The 1998-99 fiscal year was one of resolving challenges, pushing growth in new directions, and setting new standards of service and professionalism. With the accomplishments of the previous year's board of directors as a springboard, this year's board was able to satisfy all those objectives.

Most challenging was our need to resolve old issues related to licensing; and to establish a new licensing agreement that would enable ODKF to realize maximum financial benefit while

maintaining the dignity of the name and memory of Duke Kahanamoku. I'm pleased to report that, through the diligence of our licensing agent liaison committee, we did in fact meet this challenge, and now have a licensing agreement with Malama Polo, Ltd., of which the principal owner is Don Love. Mr. Love is president of Gramicci, a very reputable California company with a successful business in clothing manufacture and license. An indirect result of this resolution was a donation by TS Restaurants of \$25,000 as that company's vote of confidence in the future between its Duke restaurants and the ODKF.

Building awareness of ODKF scholarships and grants was another important objective that was ably met due to the hard work and creativity of our marketing and outreach committees. ODKF posters, produced pro bono by the ad agency of a board member, were distributed to schools statewide and resulted in a significant increase in queries about funding opportunities. The committee also established a "speakers bureau" function that will solicit grant and scholarship recipients to make presentations to school assemblies.

Of course, our grants and scholarships committee worked as hard as ever to ensure that the most deserving of students received support for their pursuits, with \$41,500 total in grants and scholarships given out. We were pleased to extend our community outreach by providing a grant to the Waianae Boys and Girls Club to build a volleyball court, and we look forward to developing an ongoing relationship of support with that organization.

Maximizing return was the objective of our finance committee, and they rose to the occasion by analyzing and researching many investment options. In the end, the equity portion of our funds was moved to a new investment manager with an exceptional track record in growth equity securities.

Our annual Gold Medalist luncheon was a particular success this year, under the direction of our development committee. It was gratifying to see grant recipients and donors meet and interact with each other. This committee also oversaw ODKF's participation in the 4th of July Macfarlane Regatta, which added over \$4,000 in revenue into ODKF coffers.

On the housekeeping side, we moved into a new downtown office, and contracted an administrative service to keep us organized, efficient and effective. Although we are no longer officed at Outrigger Canoe Club our OCC liaisons served us well this year in keeping communication flowing between the two organizations.

Throughout the year, we were grateful for the continued support of our many donors, and of the Outrigger Canoe Club board and membership. I personally am grateful for the support and enthusiasm of the 1998-99 ODKF Board, and am confident that the Foundation is in capable hands as it moves forward into the new millennium.

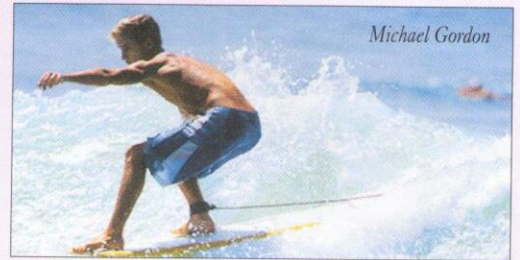

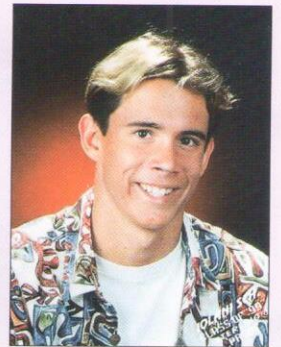

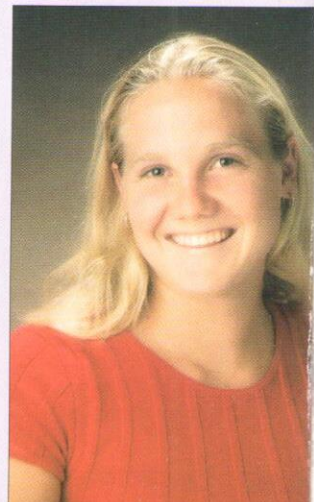

Featured speakers were scholarship recipients Kevin Flanagan and Sarah Parker along with athletic grant recipient representatives from the Hawaiian Twisters, Hawaiian Warriors Volleyball, and Boys & Girls Club of Honolulu.

Volunteers who were honored at this luncheon serve the Foundation in a variety of ways: selling T-shirts at the 4th of July Macfarlane Regatta, serving on the board and com-

mittees, researching Duke Kahanamoku history, designing scholarship posters, reviewing nearly 100 grant applications, and accepting a myriad of miscellaneous Foundation tasks with cheerful "can do" attitudes. This Foundation truly epitomizes the Hawaiian value of laulima — many hands working together.

Congratulations to Event Co-Chairs Jeanne Anderson and Wendell Brooks for a most successful and inspirational Mahalo Luncheon.

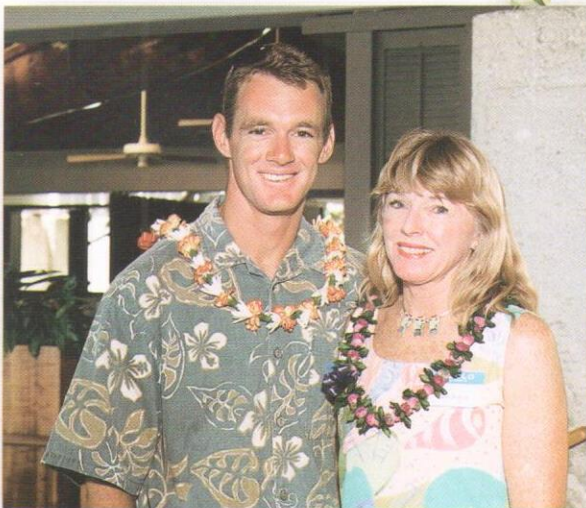

Board Designated Funds

There are five Board Designated Funds:

Muriel Macfarlane Flanders Fund: established by Muriel Flanders for support of water sports, perpetuating the Macfarlane canoe races, and honoring the activities and accomplishments of Duke Kahanamoku.

Terrence McCarthy Fund: established by Terrence McCarthy in the memory of her husband Edmond McCarthy, who was a firm believer in the combination of athletic participation and education. Mrs. McCarthy honors

her husband by supporting Hawaii's top scholar athletes.

Tom "Daddy" Haine Fund: established by The Board of Directors in 1994 at the time of the death of Tom Haine. Funds are used to support and develop the sport of volleyball in Hawaii. Haine was the Captain of the 1968 U.S. Olympic men's volleyball team. He was an 18 time USVBA All-American and in 1991 was inducted into the U.S. Volleyball Hall of Fame. He was a member of the original Outrigger Foundation which later merged with the Duke Kahanamoku Foundation to form ODKF, and at the time of his death he was a member of the ODKF Grants Committee.

The KALA KUKUA Fund: established by The Board of Directors in 1996 and named for Kala Kukea, water sportsman who died in February, 1996, at the age of 52 while kayaking off shore Waikiki. In 1996 he posthumously received the Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association John DeRego Perpetual trophy for service to the Association and the Molokai/Oahu canoe race. His own son, Nalu Kukea, was a recipient of ODKF funds for both athletic grants and schol-

arships while in college.

The Cline Mann Fund, named for John Cline Mann, water sportsman who died in 1996. He was captain of his Dartmouth College swimming team, an avid small boat sailor in sunfish and scorpions, and taught his sailing skills to junior sailors, many of them now champions.

Professionally a surveyor, an authority on Hawaiian lands and land boundaries, he was a retired engineer, and served as President of the Outrigger Canoe Club in 1964. In addition, he served on numerous committees, and was a walking historian of OCC as well as a recipient of the prestigious Winged "O" award for his contribution to Club athletics, and a life member of OCC.

A promotor of paddleboard racing and instrumental in the inauguration of three annual paddleboard races, one of these races is officially named the Cline Mann 5000 meter Paddleboard race. The first grant from the Cline Mann Fund went to this event in 1997.

A member of the original Board of Directors of the Duke Kahanamoku Foundation, founded in 1963 to honor Duke

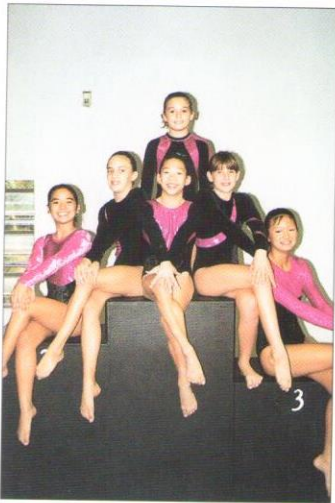
Kahanamoku during his lifetime, he played an important role in the merger of the two Foundations, the present Outrigger Duke Kahanamoku Foundation, now 12 years old.

The Board of Directors makes distributions to deserving athletes, athlete-scholars and athletic teams and events in the name of the Fund and both the Fund donor or family and the grantee of the funds are notified of the distinction.

We thank the individuals and families of the named funds for their kindness and generosity. 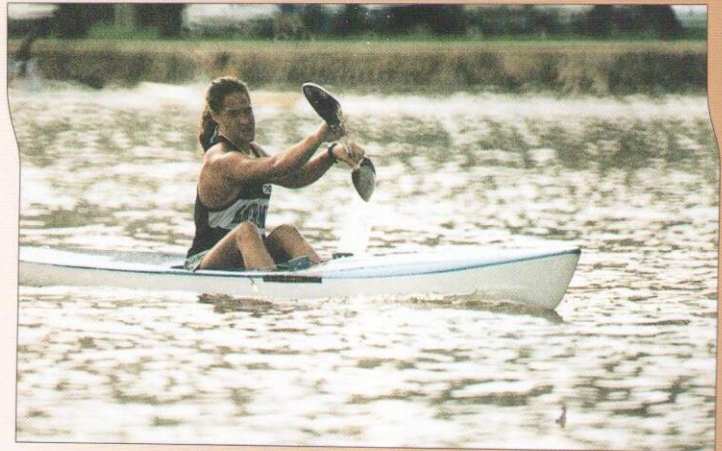
Gold Medalists

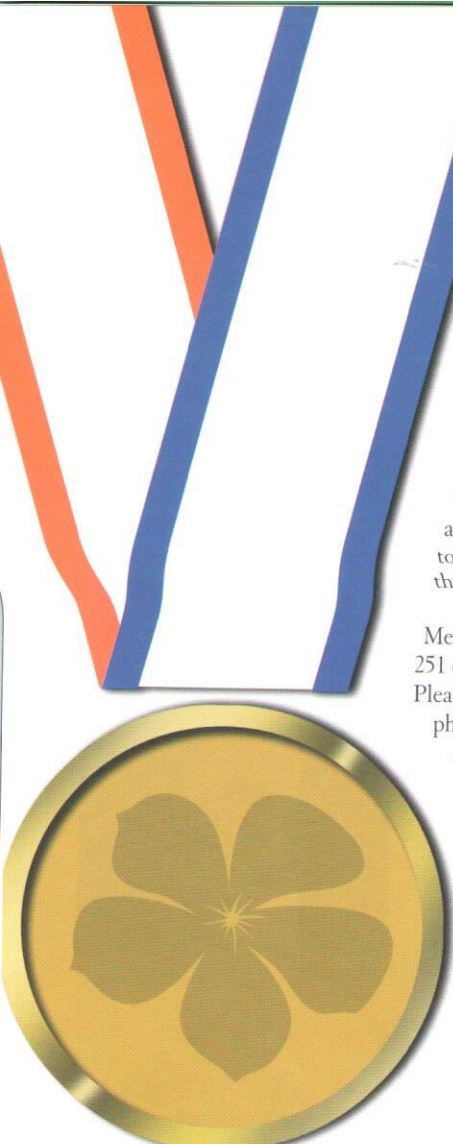

Financial Report

The Financial statements for the ODKF as of and for the year ended September 30, 1998, were reviewed by PricewaterhouseCoopers. These financial statements are available to our members by request.

At the Foundation's Annual Meeting on September 27, 1999, a report was made with regard to the Foundation's projected financial results for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1999. These financial statements are also being reviewed by PricewaterhouseCoopers, and when that review is completed in early January 2000, the financial statements will be made available to the members upon request.

Income to the Foundation comes from the donations of the Gold Medalists (those who give \$1000 or more), as well as loyal donors who pledge a specific

amount each month, and those who make an end of the year contribution. This year we also continued our fundraising through the sale of T-shirts at the annual 4th of July Macfarlane Canoe Races.

Scholarships Grants for the year totaled \$16,000 and Athletic Grants for the year totaled \$25,500.

Applications for Athletic and Scholarship Grants

There are two types of grants made by the Foundation:

Athletic grants that are usually for a specific purpose such as tournaments and other competitions. Grants may be awarded to an individual, a team or an organization sponsoring an athletic event. Athletic grant applications are accepted at any time.

Scholarship grants are given to athletes who are in need of assistance in pursuing post high school education. Applications are accepted from January to March 15. Previous scholarship recipients must reapply for their grants annually.

- A list of competitive sports, awards
- A letter from an athletic coach or trainer
- Federal tax return (or parent's if claimed as a dependent)
- A recent photo, preferably an action shot

In addition, Scholarship Grant applicants must:

- Plan to attend an accredited college as a full time student in any major
- Submit a transcript of grades
- Submit two letters of reference

In addition, Athletic Grant applicants or teams must:

- Describe their training program
- Rate themselves competitively
- Describe history of previous competition
- Provide results of competition
- Provide records and times
- Provide their personal history in the event

Scholarship and Grant requirements:

To qualify an applicant must:

- Be a resident of Hawaii and an American citizen
- Have participated in competitive sports
- Demonstrate financial need

Submit:

- A personal letter of intention
