*from Kamehameha Schools in 1910? I quote from his exact diploma, "In recognition of distinguished achievement of community, national and international service." Yes, he was a multi-talented athlete and scholar.*

*As a swimmer and Hawaiian, I feel a deep connection with Duke Kahanamoku. I look up to Duke*

## Hawaii National Guard Youth Challenge Academy Duke Kahanamoku Water Sports and Fitness Day

In just the past few years, ODKF's partnership with the Hawaii National Guard Youth Challenge Academy has brightened the future for many 16-18 year-old at-risk youths in Hawaii. ODKF has supported Youth Challenge in providing over \$10,000 in educational scholarships, as well as sponsoring the annual Duke Kahanamoku Water Sports Day at Ko Olina Lagoon. Support from the Outrigger Canoe Club, Hui Nalu Canoe Club, Honolulu City and County Lifeguards, and See 'n Sea Scuba, aid to create a day of fun and excitement. Cadets not only gain knowledge and take part in various water sports, but also put into action what they have learned about responsibility, teamwork, and leadership.



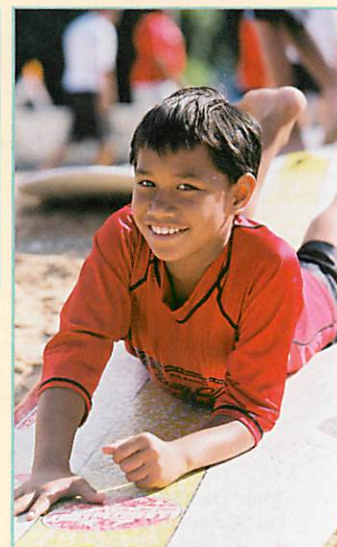
The Hawaii National Guard Youth Challenge Academy provides youth with a second chance to obtain their high school diploma by developing skills to be successful, responsible, and productive citizens in the community. The voluntary 5-month residential and 12-month post-residential program, stress the importance of obtaining a high school education, while learning life skills and the preparation necessary to take the next step and strive to reach their goals. Since its inception in 1994, Youth Challenge has graduated 24 classes with over 1,750 students completing the difficult, yet rewarding program.

The 5th Annual Duke Ocean Sports & Fitness Day was held on Saturday, August 12, at Ala Moana Beach. First-time youth attendee participants were provided with longer rotations to experience more volleyball, canoe paddling, water safety and surfing. Representatives on the volunteer committee included ODKF, Outrigger Canoe Club, City & County of Honolulu Lifeguards, Hawaiian Island Creations, UH Wahine Volleyball, Duke's Restaurant, HMSA, Jamba Juice, BGCH Board and Staff.

Attendance included more than 150 youth members (age range 9-13 years old) from Waianae, Nanakuli, Ewa Beach, Aliamanu, McCully, Papakolea, and Kailua. With the addition of volunteer manpower (chaperones and onsite rotation and support) the entire group totalled approximately 250 people. In a quick evaluation of the day: the longer rotations worked out quite well, the site was great, the food hit the spot, and the kids clearly enjoyed themselves.

# THE PURPOSE

of the Outrigger Duke Kahanamoku Foundation is to financially support the development of individuals and organizations that perpetuate the spirit and legacy of Duke Kahanamoku. • ODKF accomplishes this by encouraging athletes and scholars whose endeavors will contribute to the growth and development of athletics in Hawai'i; supporting athletic events and participation by teams and individuals in local, national and international competition; supporting individuals in furthering their education; and assisting in preserving, perpetuating and developing sports which have a special cultural or historical significance to Hawai'i.

## BOARD DESIGNATED FUNDS

### There are seven ODKF Board Designated Funds.

#### Muriel Macfarlane Flanders Fund:

Established by Muriel Flanders to support water sports in Hawai'i, to perpetuate the Macfarlane Fourth of July Regatta and to honor the accomplishments of Duke Paoa Kahanamoku. Through this Fund this gracious lady's legacy will surely endure.

#### Terrence McCarthy Fund:

Established by Terrence McCarthy in memory of her husband Edmond McCarthy, who firmly believed in the combination of athletics and education. Mrs. McCarthy honors her husband by supporting Hawai'i's top scholar-athletes.

#### Tom "Daddy" Haine Fund:

Established in 1994, funds support the sport of volleyball in Hawai'i.

Haine was the captain of the 1968 U.S. Olympic men's volleyball team. He was an 18-time USVBA All-American and in 1991 was inducted into the US Volleyball Hall of Fame. He was a member of the original Outrigger Foundation that later merged with the Duke Kahanamoku Foundation to form ODKF.

**Kala Kukea Fund:** Established in 1996 and named for one of Hawai'i's top overall water sportsmen. Kukea touched the lives of many young athletes in his short 52 years on earth. He was an outstanding competitor, coach and role model. In 1996 he posthumously received the Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association John DeRego Perpetual trophy for service to the Association and to the Molokai-Oahu canoe race.

**Cline Mann Fund:** Named for John Cline Mann, a superb water sportsman who died in 1996. He was captain of his Dartmouth College swimming team, an avid small boat sailor, and a strong promoter of paddleboard racing. Grants from this fund help to support the annual Cline Mann Paddleboard Race. Cline Mann was also a member of the original Board of Directors of the Duke Kahanamoku Foundation (DKF) that was founded in 1963. He played an instrumental role in the merger of DKF and the Outrigger Foundation to create the present Outrigger Duke Kahanamoku Foundation (ODKF).

**Thomas Arnott Fund:** Established by Marian Arnott in loving memory of her husband who was a great supporter of both OCC and ODKF. Tommy Arnott, a masterful surfer, was also recognized for competing

in canoe races with Duke Kahanamoku. As teammates they beat all their competition in the early 1940s. Consequently this fund supports interscholastic canoe paddling in Hawai'i.

**Henry Ayau Fund:** Established in memory of this renowned athlete and his legacy. A "Moloka'i Boy," Henry excelled in life as a businessman, sportsman and community servant. An exceptional athlete, Henry was a noted baseball player, surfer, canoe paddler, and world-class free diver. Many viewed him as a modern day "Ambassador of Aloha."

ODKF awards grants to athletes, teams, scholar-athletes and sporting events in the name of the above listed funds. We thank the families who have made these grants possible.

## Applications for Athletic and Scholarship Grants

### GENERAL INFORMATION

There are two types of grants made by the Foundation. **Athletic grants** are usually for a specific purpose such as tournaments or competitions. Grants may be awarded to an individual, team or organization. Athletic grant applications are accepted at any time throughout the year. **Scholarship grants** are given to athletes in need of assistance in pursuing post high school education. Applications are accepted from January 1 to April 1 of each year.

### GRANT REQUIREMENTS:

#### **Applicant must:**

Be a resident of Hawai'i and an American citizen  
Participate in a competitive sport  
Demonstrate financial need

#### **Applicant must submit:**

A completed grant application  
A personal letter of intention  
A list of competitive sports and awards  
A letter from an athletic coach or trainer  
Last federal tax return (or parents' if claimed as a dependent)  
A recent photo, preferably an athletic action shot

#### **In addition, Scholarship Grant applicants must:**

Plan to attend an accredited college as a full time student  
Submit a transcript of grades  
Submit two letters of reference

#### **In addition, Athletic Grant applicants or teams must:**

Describe their training program  
Describe their history of previous competitions  
Provide results of competitions with records and times  
Provide organizational and financial documentation
