The foundation, through its grants and scholarships, also allows us to perpetuate the memory of the late Duke Paoa Kahanamoku, who was not only the greatest Hawai'i water sports athlete of all time, but whose dignity, conduct and athletic achievements continue to set the standard for all athletes everywhere.

This year has been a tremendous one for the foundation. Our grants and scholarship committee approved 41 grants and awarded a total of \$39,200. Of special note, two of our grants helped athletes from

supporters generously contributed over \$75,000 in cash donations this year. At the same time our operating expenses were down nearly 54% from the prior fiscal year. Fiscal responsibility was (and remains) a top priority for the ODKF board.

Through the efforts of our licensing agent, Malama Pono Inc., and its principal Don Love we have finalized the agreement with TS Enterprises, owner and operator of the highly successful Duke's Canoe Clubs in Waikiki, Kaua'i and California. This partnership between ODKF and TS Restaurants is financially rewarding for the foundation

in bringing ODKF to an even higher level of achievement and effectiveness.

I personally am grateful for the spirited support and enthusiasm of the ODKF Board and for OCC board liaison Peter Nottage for his constant guidance. With all of this support you may rest assured that the Outrigger Duke Kahanamoku Foundation will thrive and succeed in its mission as we move forward into the year 2001.

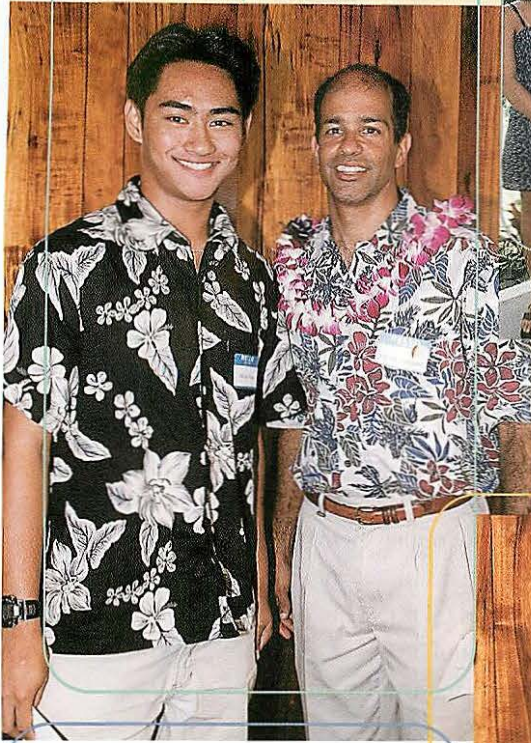

BOARD DESIGNATED FUNDS

There are six ODKF Board Designated Funds.

Muriel Macfarlane Flanders Fund: established by Muriel Flanders to support water sports in Hawai'i, to perpetuate the Macfarlane Fourth of July Regatta, and to honor the accomplishments of Duke Paoa Kahanamoku.

Terrence McCarthy Fund: established by Terrence McCarthy in memory of her husband Edmond McCarthy, who firmly believed in the combination of athletic participation and education. Mrs. McCarthy honors her husband by supporting Hawai'i's top scholar athletes.

Tom "Daddy" Haine Fund: established by the Board of Directors in 1994, funds support and develop the sport of volleyball in Hawai'i. Haine was the captain of the 1968 U.S. Olympic men's volleyball team. He was an 18-time

USVBA All-American and in 1991 was inducted into the U.S. Volleyball Hall of Fame. He was a member of the original Outrigger Foundation that later merged with the Duke Kahanamoku Foundation to form ODKF.

Kala Kukea Fund: established by the Board of Directors in 1996 and named for Kala Kukea who was one of Hawai'i's top overall water sportsman. Kukea touched the lives of many young athletes in his short 52 years of life. He was an outstanding competitor, coach and role model. In 1996 he posthumously received the Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association John DeRego Perpetual trophy for service to the Association and to the Molokai/Oahu canoe race.

Cline Mann Fund: named for John Cline Mann, a superb water sportsman who died in 1996. He was captain of his Dartmouth College swimming

team, an avid small boat sailor, and a strong promoter of paddleboard racing. Grants from this fund help to support the annual Cline Mann Paddleboard Race. Cline Mann was also a member of the original Board of Directors of the Duke Kahanamoku Foundation (DKF) which was founded in 1963. He then played an instrumental role in the merger of DKF and the Outrigger Foundation to create the present Outrigger Duke Kahanamoku Foundation (ODKF).

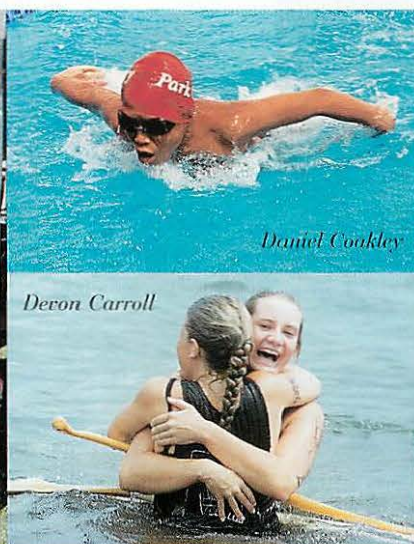
Thomas Arnott Fund: established this year by Marian Arnott in loving memory of her husband who was a great supporter of both OCC and ODKF. Tommy Arnott, a masterful surfer, was also recognized for competing in canoe races with Duke Kahanamoku. As teammates they beat all their competition in the early 1940's. Consequently this fund will support interscholastic canoe

paddling in Hawai'i.

The Board of Directors of ODKF grants awards to individual athletes, athletic teams, scholar-athletes and sporting events in the name of the above listed board designated funds. We thank the individuals and families who have established these special funds for their kind generosity.

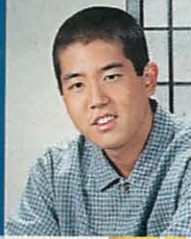




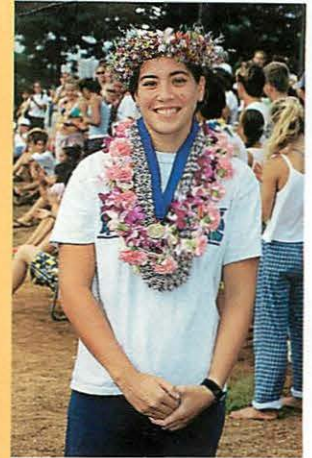

GOLD MEDALISTS

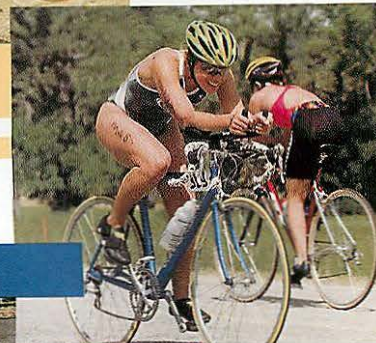
The Gold Medalist program began in 1990 as a way to acknowledge those who have contributed \$1,000 or more to ODKF in a given year.

FINANCIAL REPORT

The financial statements for the ODKF as of and for the year ended September 30, 1999, were reviewed by PricewaterhouseCoopers. These financial statements are available to our members by request.

At the foundation's annual meeting on September 25, 2000, a report was made on the foundation's projected financial results for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2000. These financial statements are now being reviewed by PricewaterhouseCoopers. When that review is completed in early January 2001, these documents will also be available to the members upon request.

Foundation income came

from donors who specify an amount be charged to their OCC account each month, as well as those who make a one-time annual contribution. Funds were also raised through the sale of tee shirts at the annual Walter J. Macfarlane Canoe Regatta on the 4th of July. We also received additional income via royalty payments from Malama Pono, Inc. this year.

Scholarship grants for the year totaled \$19,000 and athletic grants for the year totaled \$20,200. Operational expenses were held to \$42,300.

Applications for Athletic and Scholarship Grants

Athletic Grants and Scholarship Grants

There are two types of grants made by the Foundation.

Athletic grants are usually for a specific purpose such as tournaments or competitions. Grants may be awarded to an individual, a team or an organization sponsoring an athletic event. Athletic grant applications are accepted at any time throughout the year.

Scholarship grants are given to athletes in need of assistance in pursuing post high school education. Applications are accepted between January 1 - March 15 of each year. Previous scholarship recipients must reapply for their grant annually.

Scholarship and Grant requirements:

Applicant must:

- Be a resident of Hawai'i and an American citizen
- Participate in competitive sports
- Demonstrate financial need

Applicant must submit:

- A personal letter of intention
- A list of competitive sports

and awards

A letter from an athletic coach or trainer

Federal tax return (or parents' if claimed as a dependent)

A recent photo, preferably an athletic action shot

In addition, Scholarship Grant applicants must:

- Plan to attend an accredited college as a full time student
- Submit a transcript of grades
- Submit two letters of reference

In addition, Athletic Grant applicants or teams must:

- Describe their training program
- Describe their history of previous competitions
- Provide results of competitions with records and times
- Provide their history in the event
