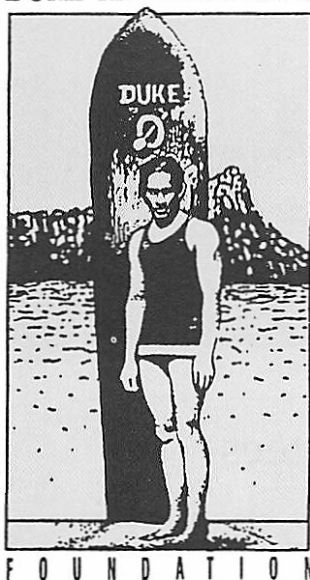

This past year has been a banner year for the Foundation. We were able to grant 12 scholarships, more than any previous year. The eight men and four women scholar-athletes are attending MIT, Harvard, Cornell, UH-Manoa (2), UC Irvine, Dartmouth (2), UCLA (2), and Stanford (2).

Amazingly enough, the two at Stanford, from different islands, and never having met, are sharing a dormitory. They have Hawaii AND the Foundation in common.

We have supported athletes in Hawaii in competitive sports on the local, national and international level in swimming, sailing, kayaking, water polo and paddling.

Any individual or team, of any age or any sport, is encouraged to apply if they believe that financial support from the ODKF can enhance their ability and bring recognition to all the athletes of Hawaii.

As you are aware, most grants are to those participating in water related sports, which is only fitting as the Outrigger Canoe Club, founded in 1908 to perpetuate surfing and canoeing, and the Duke Kahanamoku Foundation, founded to honor the world's best known ocean and water sports athlete, are the origins of the present Outrigger Duke Kahanamoku Foundation.

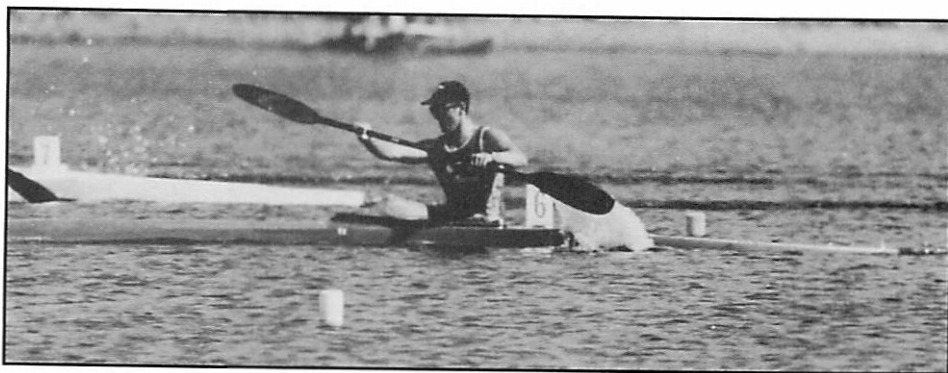

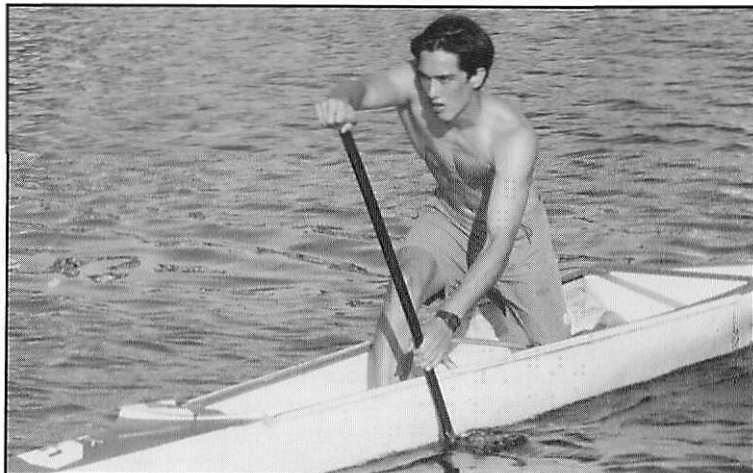

ODKF Holds Annual Thank You Luncheon

On June 16, the Outrigger Duke Kahanamoku Foundation held its annual luncheon to thank volunteers who assist with various fund raising activities, and honor the athletic and scholastic grant recipients. This year's luncheon also included 21 Gold Medalists.

Gold Medalists are donors to the Foundation who have given gifts of \$1,000 or more. Each Gold Medalist was asked to stand to be recognized and awarded a lucite cube enclosing a "gold medal" featuring Duke Kahanamoku's likeness.

For most of the Gold Medalists, this was their first opportunity to see where their philanthropy has been directed. There were seven athletic grant recipients and seven scholarship grant recipients present

to personally thank the Gold Medalists.

Volunteers help the Foundation in a variety of ways: through book sales which provide royalties to the Foundation, T-shirt sales at the 4th of July Macfarlane Regatta in Waikiki, and by assisting with mass mailings. Many volunteers are also donors, making regular monthly pledges to the Foundation.

Each of the athletes thanked the Foundation for "being there", coming through with assistance "at the right time" and keeping faith in the athlete's ability to excel in a sport.

Athletic goals like the Olympics require years of planning ahead, and the Foundation has made a commitment to Hawaii's best contenders in water sports to help them toward their goals.

Meet the 1992-93 ODKF Scholars and Athletes

Jon Allen

Jon Allen's grant sent him to the Junior Nationals in August where he placed 9th in the 100 meter backstroke with a personal best time. He is a sophomore at UH-Manoa and a member of the swim team.

Kathy-Lyn Allen

Kathy-Lyn received this athletic grant to compete in the Summer Senior Nationals where she placed 10th in the 200 Individual Medley. Currently a junior at Auburn University, she earned NCAA All American honors seven times in her first two years.

Roger Arnemann

Roger Arnemann received both scholarship and athletic grants. His athletic grant enabled him to participate in the 1993 Nautica/US Sailing Youth Championship in Connecticut in June where he finished 22nd. He is a freshman at Stanford and a member of their sailing team.

Meghan Atwood

Meghan Atwood, a 1993 graduate from Waialua, is attending UH Manoa in pre-law and swimming backstroke for the UH swim team. She placed 2nd in the 100 yard backstroke in the OIA Western Division Championships last year, and was Captain of her swimming team.

David Buck

David Buck used his grant to participate in the National Championships in Indianapolis where he

won three medals and a spot on the Senior National Team for the second year in a row. He has been named to several U.S. Junior National teams.

Unbeatabulls Soccer Team

The UNBEATABULLS Soccer Team received a grant for their team trip to the U.S. Youth Challenge Cup at the Far West Regional Tournament in Albuquerque in June. They were eligible for this trip by finishing as the top Boys 12 HYSA soccer team in the state.

Ralen Chang

This summer Ralen Chang competed in the West Team U.S. Kayak Olympic Trials and the Nationals, resulting in selection to the National B Team. Ralen is a senior at the University of CA-Irvine and coached kayaking this summer.

Kathryn Colin

Kathryn Colin used her funds to attend the U.S. Canoe and Kayak Sprints in Indianapolis in August where she was selected for the Senior National B Team for Sprint Kayak. She rows at the University of Washington.

Summer Craig

Summer Craig is a freshman at Dartmouth College where she is hoping to be on the sailing team. Summer used her athletic grant to compete in the US/Rolux Junior Women's Championships for the Leiter Cup in Houston. She placed 48th out of 80.

Chris Duplanty

Chris Duplanty is the starting goalkeeper on the U.S. National Water Polo Team, and is in training for the 1996 Atlanta Olympics. He is ranked one of the top three goalkeepers in the world. Chris won a silver medal in the 1988 Olympics and a fourth in 1992.

Todd Duplanty

Todd Duplanty is a continuing grantee now on his third ODKF scholarship. He attends UCLA where he plays water polo as a member of the Varsity Water Polo team.

James Farnum

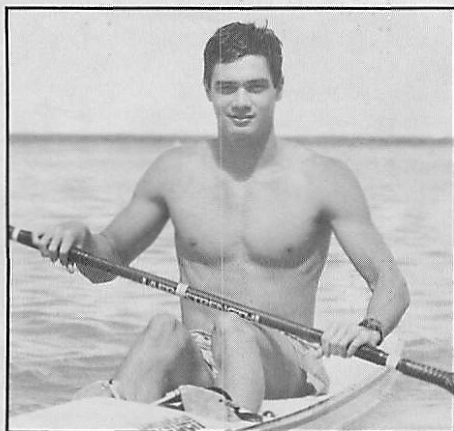

James Hondo

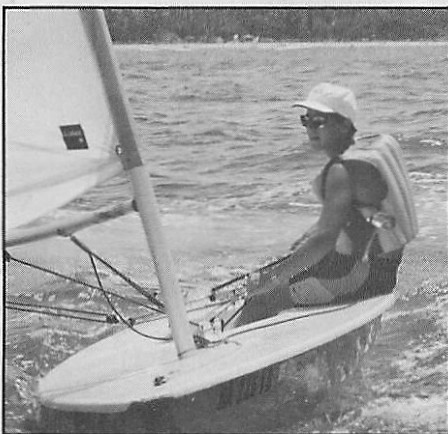

Deborah Lambert

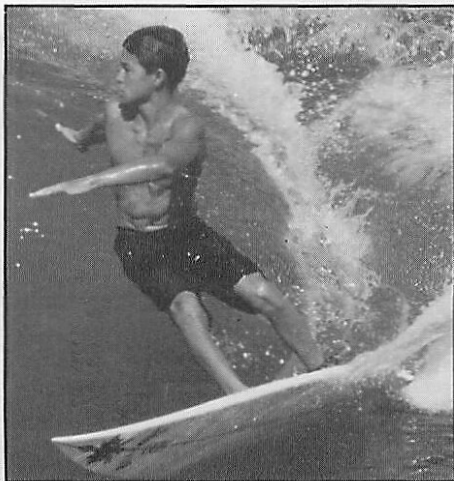

Jan Okada

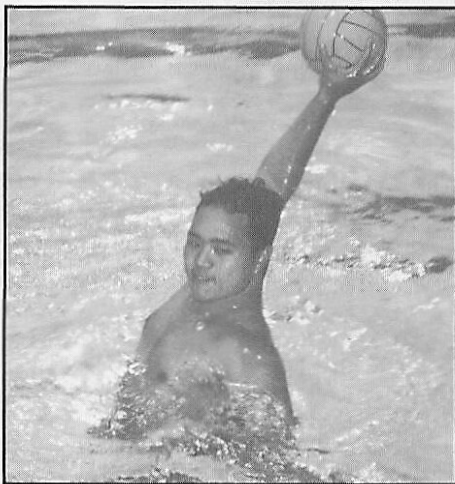

Paul Tan

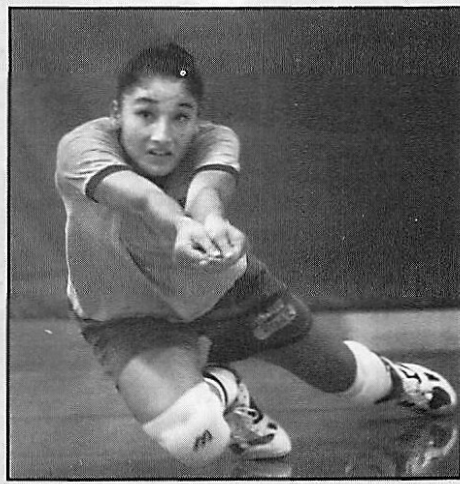

Financial Statement

The Outrigger Duke Kahanamoku Foundation's total fund balance is \$503,243.

Income to the Foundation comes from the donations of the Gold Medalists (those who give \$1000 or more), as well as loyal donors who pledge a specific amount each month, and those who make an end of the year contribution.

Our fund raisers in 1992-93 included the sale of T-shirts at the annual 4th of July Macfarlane Canoe Races in Waikiki, and a portion of the sales on two books, Waikiki

Beach Boys and The Hawaiian Canoe.

Scholarships for the year totaled \$12,000.

Athletic Grants for the year totaled \$15,550.

Some funds are donated for a specific sport, and we encourage anyone who particularly wants to take advantage of the tax savings of supporting your favorite sport to investigate this gift giving option.

History of a Unique Foundation

The Outrigger Canoe Club is headquarters of one of the nation's most unique and special philanthropic institutions: The Outrigger Duke Kahanamoku Foundation. There is no other organization that supports Hawaii scholar-athletes.

The Foundation's objective is to help young people, in the hope that some of them may someday emulate Duke Kahanamoku's remarkable accomplishments.

The ODKF is the successor organization of two other foundations. The Duke Kahanamoku Foundation was founded in 1963,

during the latter years of Duke's life. A group of his friends sought to honor his many contributions to the Hawaiian Islands by establishing scholarships for deserving students who demonstrated proficiency in sports of traditional interest to the islands. In 1980, The Outrigger Canoe Club Foundation was created to formalize a program of grants for participants in sports.

Representatives of the two foundations met in 1986 to explore means by which both could do a more effective job of fulfilling their respective missions. The result was

a merger, and the creation of the ODKF.

The Foundation now regularly awards scholarships and grants to enable scholar/athletes to continue their training, to compete nationally, and to prepare for international competition.

Applications for Assistance

There are two types of grants made by the Foundation.

Athletic grants are usually for a specific purpose, or specific competition. These monies may be applied for at any time, and may be granted to an individual or to a team.

Scholarship grants are given only once a year, applications are made in January and February, and grantees are notified in March. The scholarship money is sent directly to the school the grantee is attending, and is applied to the student's account.

If a grantee continues in school with satisfactory grades, they are given preference in their reapplication for succeeding years, but they must reapply for the grant annually.

Scholarship and Grant Requirements:

To qualify an applicant must:

- Be a resident of Hawaii and an American citizen.
- Have participated in competitive sports.
- Demonstrate financial need.
- Submit a personal letter of intentions.
- Submit a list of competitive sports, awards.
- Submit a letter from an athletic coach or trainer.
- Submit federal tax return (or parent's if claimed as a dependent).
- Submit a recent photo, preferably action.

In addition, Scholarship applicants must:

- Plan to attend an accredited college as a full time student in any major, or plan to major in law enforcement, political science or international relations.
- Submit a transcript of grades.
- Provide two letters of reference.

In addition, Athletic Grant applicants must:

- Describe their training program.
- Rate themselves competitively.
- Describe previous competition and results of that competition.
- Provide records and times.
- Describe changes made in training.
- Provide personal history in the event.

Planned Giving to the ODKF

There are many advantages to planned giving for donors. A bequest, for example, costs the donor nothing. It is deducted from the estate of the donor, lowering the amount of estate tax that will be owed.

Many forms of planned giving go into effect during the donor's lifetime and can either pay the donor or save the donor money during his or her lifetime as well as lowering estate taxes or, in the case of irrevocable trusts, avoiding probate altogether.

Planned giving allows a donor to help ensure that what he or she stands for and believes in and contributes to, will continue. People who have supported an organization for years and years have a chance, at no cost to themselves, to see that the organization continues to be supported.

Anyone can make a bequest. All that is required is that you make a

'will, and that you own something you want to give the Foundation. Many donors think that bequests are only for wealthy people. In fact, if all you own is a car, you can leave that to the ODKF, and it can be sold for the value of the car. Most people have more "hard assets" than liquid assets.

You should, of course, consult your financial or legal advisor, but the simplest bequest can be made by simply stating "I give and bequeath to the Outrigger Duke Kahanamoku Foundation the sum of \$ _____ (or a specific piece of property) to be used as the Board of Directors directs."
