With Hui Nalu and Waikiki Surf clubs failing to enter the races, the competition was limited to crews from the Outrigger Canoe Club.

Hui Nalu and Waikiki Surf clubs objected to OCC's move to enter two crews and as a result withdrew their paddlers.

OCC officials conceded that points won by their No. 1 crew only would count toward the team championship but that the second crew could qualify for medals. The rival clubs objected to this.

Lonesome people should find the two following songs (on Columbia 38766) interesting even though it might be only in their imagination:

Me and My Teddy Bear; *I Found My Mamma*.

Girls careful of their clothes should enjoy *Twisted Stockings* (Nat "King" Cole, Capitol 915). Others might just find it disturbing.

Them There Eyes and *Crazy He Calls Me* are two good light numbers by Peggy Lee, Capitol 898.

Two songs by Herb Jeffries, Columbia 38769: *There Goes My Heart*; *Swamp Girl*. If she's worth while it might be okay.

No Figs; *Double Date*, on Columbia 1-557. Sounds good. Who would have time for figs on a double date?
