



Aunty Eva Pomroy

Today the Outrigger Canoe Club is remembering Aunty Eva Mauaeikakaluaolonoikahiki Pomroy who helped maintain and perpetuate Hawaiian traditions at OCC for nearly half a century. Aunty Eva was born and raised in Waikiki and was surfing at Kuhio Beach when koa boards were the only boards. For nearly 30 years, Aunty Eva greeted visitors at the Outrigger, first in Waikiki and then at its Diamond Head Clubhouse. She has named and blessed the Club's outrigger canoes and babies, given ti leaves to crews before they paddled, led prayers in Hawaiian and showered young and old with her special brand of aloha. Following her retirement in 1974, she continued to support Outrigger athletes until her death in April.

Walter J. Macfarlane Day Canoe Regatta

Tuesday, July 4, 1989, Waikiki Beach
Sponsored by the Outrigger Canoe Club

Walter James Macfarlane, known as "Walter Mac", native Hawaiian businessman, legislator and sportsman, died in 1943 while serving as president of the Outrigger Canoe Club. Just a few years earlier, during a decline in membership, he led a drive to negotiate a new sublease from Matson Navigation Company and to build a new clubhouse at the original club site (now the Outrigger Hotel), owned by the Queen Emma Estate. The July 4th Regatta of 1943 inaugurated an annual 4th of July Regatta in his memory.

The beautiful sterling silver trophy, which bears the crew names of all the winners in the senior six-man event, was donated in 1943 by Matson Navigation Company. Walter

Mac's family continues to actively support this regatta. In 1972, Walter Mac's sister, Mrs. Walter Flanders, donated the beautiful koa wave trophy. Each year, this trophy is presented to the club that wins the regatta.

In 1980, Walter Guild, Walter Mac's grand-nephew dedicated a handcrafted koa canoe trophy to his grandmother Muriel Flanders. This trophy is presented each year to the winning Boys 18 crew. In 1984, Mrs. Flanders donated a sterling silver bowl for the Senior Women and milo bowls for the Junior and Senior Masters Women. Today a member of his family will be making the trophy presentations.
