Coach John D. Kaupiko's Paddlers Break Long Domination of Outrigger Club in Blue Ribbon Event; Big Crowd Watches

The Waikiki Surf Club came through with an apset team victory in the annual Walter James Macfarlane memorial canoe races off Waikiki resterday.

Coached by Wally Froiseth, the strong-backed WSC paddlers captured five of the eight official events and had a total of 30 points for their day's oil. Hui Nalu finished second with 20, while





The crowd that jammed the beach received one of its biggest thrills when Coach John D. Kaupiko's Hui Nalu won the blue ribbon senior men's six event, breaking OCC's six-year hold on the Macfarlane trophy. The winning boat was composed of Herman Apo, Samson Kekai, H. A. Ahuna, George Young, Richard Makua and Robert Kekai. They finished about 300 feet in front of the OCC entry.
