Lanikai tames tide

hile Wednesday's regatta technically didn't count, the level of fierce competition on the water remained as high as the day's unusual tide.

Paddlers braved rough ocean conditions and relentless surf, but Lanikai Canoe Club rode the swells to its fourth consecutive Oahu Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association victory of the season at the 70th annual Walter J. Macfarlane Regatta at Waikiki Beach. OHCRA's traditional July 4 event was held in the waters fronting the iconic Royal Hawaiian and Outrigger hotels as thousands of spectators looked on

from the beach and hotel balconies.

Lanikai, which finished the regatta with 98 points, and Outrigger Canoe Club have combined to win the past 19 Macfarlane regattas. Lanikai has claimed 12 victories in that time span.

The regatta was essentially an exhibition as it had no bearing on the organization's cumulative point standings, which determine state championship berths. The Macfarlane is traditionally a favorite of many paddlers as the course is set up perpendicular to the shore and allows crews to catch ocean bumps as they race toward the finish line.

Races are often won and lost

based on catching the right wave at the right time, and many crews used the open steering exemption, which allows experienced steersmen to paddle in as many races as necessary to help the club keep its paddlers and canoes safe. In the early afternoon, as the tide crept in, waves increased in height and frequency, and continually swamped canoes as crews zigzagged to avoid hitting the walls of water head on.

The perpetual Senior Women's Bowl and Walter Macfarlane Memorial Trophy were awarded to the victorious crews in the women's and men's senior races. The respective winners from Healani and Lanikai were awarded the trophies in a postrace ceremony fronting Duke's, which now stands in the area formerly occupied by the Outrigger Canoe Club's original headquarters. Following tradition, the winning crew members took sips of champagne from the cups top-

ping both trophies.

"We get to drink from the cup, we get to drink from the cup!" exclaimed Celeste Pai'aina, a member of Healani's winning senior women's crew after she emerged from the canoe. "We took lickings going out there, we kept taking on water. But it's a big deal here to

drink from the cup, so we were jonesing for that."

Healani completed the 1½-mile course in 12 minutes, 36.33 seconds and held off Lanikai (13 minutes, 14.19 seconds) and Kailua (13 minutes, 53.64 seconds). Outrigger took an early lead that it carried through the second turn at the mile

marker, but the host club flipped after confronting a large wave and ceded the advantage.

The victory is believed to be the first for the Healani women in the history of this particular race.

"We were just trying to focus on our lane and stay straight," said Sarah Gilman who occupied the third seat in Healani's winning canoe that also included Maureen Kleaver, Myrna Resop, Bianca Paishon and Kea Paishon. "It shows that we have a strong program and that everybody works together. It paid off for us today."

The final race of the day featured members of the armed forces competing in a special Independence Day competition for bragging rights. Various clubs sponsored a branch of the military that in turn used that club's canoe and an experienced steersperson. The quarter-mile exhibition featured eight canoes, and the Coast Guard crew emerged victorious - although, as was clear by the applause for all participants, the race was more about celebrating each paddler's service to the country.

"Having the opportunity to come down and participate in this distinctly Hawaiian event, it was an awesome honor," said Don Robertson, a first-time canoe paddler representing the Air Force. "We had a great crew, and it was great fun. You couldn't ask for a better location or a better backdrop."

Lanikai's victory also netted the club its fourth AAA Division (27-39 crews entered) title of the season, while Outrigger (63 points), Kailua (57 points) and Hui Nalu (54 points) rounded out the large division.

Leeward Kai claimed the AA Division (14-26 crews entered) crown with 35 points and Waimanalo and Anuenue shared the A Division (1-13 crews entered) trophy with 11 points apiece.

The OHCRA clubs have the weekend off and return to action on July 15 at Kaneohe Bay for the annual John D. Kaupiko Regatta. The event will also feature races that were postponed two weeks ago at the Waimanalo Regatta due to dangerous ocean conditions. The Na Ohana O Na Hui Wa'a organization returns to action at Maili Beach Park on Sunday.
