## Lanikai rules waves

### Rebounds with big win at Macfarlane

The Lanikai Canoe Club came back with a vengeance to win the Walter J. Macfarlane Memorial Regatta yesterday off Waikiki Beach.

One week after suffering its first loss of the season, Lanikai scored a season-high 96 points to win the prestigious event. The Macfarlane Regatta, which is part of the Oahu Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association, has been held every year since 1943, making it the longestrunning canoe regatta in Hawaii.

"We understand the history and respect that comes with this race," said Lanikai head coach Kalani Irvine. "So it's a big thing for us to win it."

Lanikai didn't just win the Macfarlane Regatta for the second time in three years, it dominated. The club from Windward Oahu won 12 of the 33 races and scored at least one point in 31.

Lanikai's youth crews won four of the first five races of the day to build a lead that would never be challenged. Outrigger, the host club of the regatta, made a late charge but still wound up a distant second with 74 points.

Kailua, which defeated Lanikai last week, was third with 38. Hui Lanakila won three races to win the A division (for clubs with less than 16 crews) with 34 points.

"We could have done better," said Outrigger head coach David Buck. "But I guess it was luck of the draw. It seemed like wherever a wave was, we weren't."

Waves were breaking in the 1- to 3-foot range off Waikiki yesterday, allowing crews to ride as long as 200 yards in some races.

Perhaps more important, a Macfarlane Regatta rule allows every club to use an open steersperson for every race for safety purposes. Lanikai took full advantage, alternating brothers John and Jim Foti in the steersman's seat for several races.



"You put an expert steersman with a 12-year-old crew, you can see how much of a difference it makes," said Kailua head coach Cliff Ornellas.

Added Irvine: "I'm glad John and Jim paddle for Lanikai, put it that way."

Of Lanikai's 12 race wins, the Fotis steered nine. John Foti steered the girls 13-under and women golden masters crews to Macfarlane record times.

But the most daring steering was completed by Jim in the senior men's race, which is regarded as the top division in canoe regattas.

Paddling to shore with the lead in the last ¼-mile of the 2-mile race, Foti said he turned and saw Outrigger catch a 2-foot wave.

"I was like, 'Oh, oh, here rial Trophy and gets to drink to paddle and have fun."

they come," he said.

So Foti steered the Lanikai canoe over toward the wave, which was two lanes — or about 30 feet — away.

"There was a point when we were at a 45-degree angle and still trying to get into the wave," said Foti. "And I thought we lost it because Outrigger was on it going full steam ahead."

But the strategy worked as Lanikai eventually caught the wave and rode side-by-side with Outrigger. As they rode toward the finish line, Foti angled his canoe back toward their lane, where they were able to edge Outrigger by .59 of a second.

It was Lanikai's seventh consecutive senior men's victory at the Macfarlane Regatta. The winner of that division is awarded the Macfarlane Memorial Trophy and gets to drink champagne from a silver cup at the awards presentation.

"We take special pride in that race," said Irvine, who also paddled in the winning senior crew. "But, man, that was a little too exciting for me."

Still, Outrigger had its best showing of the season, winning seven races, including a record-setting performance by its women novice A crew. Hui Nalu also set a record in the junior women's race.

Kailua, which scored 81 points last week, won just three races, although Ornellas said he did not expect his club to contend for the Macfarlane title.

"We're not a club that is used to surfing a lot," said Ornellas. "That's no reason to lose, of course. But we knew it wasn't our thing, so we used this race to give a lot of people a chance to paddle and have fun."
