Late surge helps host club reclaim Macfarlane title

The Outrigger Canoe Club made it clear to the other clubs in the Oahu Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association yesterday:

Relying on a strong finish—
three victories in the final five
races of the day— Outrigger
edged Lanikai, 94-88, to win the
Walter J. Macfarlane Regatta at
Waikiki Beach. Outrigger has
hosted the Macfarlane Regatta
for the past 55 years.

"This is our race, we host it and there's a lot of tradition," said Outrigger head coach Mark Sandvold. "It means a lot to the

club to win this regatta. This one is special to us."

Especially so this year since Lanikai took the regatta last year.

Early in yesterday's regatta, it appeared that Lanikai was on its way to defending that title. Lanikai won four of the 11 youth races to take an early 31-21 advantage over Outrigger.

By then, it was clear that it would be a two-team race for

the overall title. Surprisingly, Sandvold was happy with the situation his club was in.

"We won some of those early races, which we haven't done in the past," he said. "And we're traditionally strong at the end of the day, so I wasn't worried."

Not even a reversal of fortunes in the middle of the day during the open division races could dampen the Outrigger

However, when the occasional wave did appear, it pushed through the first four lanes. Lanes five through seven did not get a wave all day.


