



"Everybody was coming up and saying, 'It's up to you guys,' " said Outrigger masters paddler Bill Bright. "But we didn't really know exactly what the situation was."

No matter. Conditions favored Outrigger crews all day, and the men's masters victory epitomized that.

"There were waves to catch, just not big ones," said Bright.
"I think you had to know

where to look for them."

Outrigger, which practices just a few miles from Waikiki Beach, seemed to find them the best. Of the 31 races it entered yesterday, Outrigger won 14 and scored in 15 others (top four in each race score points).

"You get those kinds of consistent results, you should win," said Schrader.

But even in second, Lanikai was impressive, winning 15 races yesterday.

"What we did today tells us we're not a fluke," said Lanikai head coach Bob Puakea. "We
