Outrigger dominates Macfarlane again

Yesterday's 49th annual Walter J. Macfarlane Canoe Regatta off sun-splashed Waikiki Beach was billed as a big-wave competition pitting paddlers' skills against the huge breaking surf.

But that matchup didn't materialize on this Fourth of July. Few good surfing waves were to be found on an unusually placid Ma-

mala Bay.

"Hard paddling, both out and back. No big waves to ride today," Outrigger Canoe Club steersman

Tom Conner said.

"Flat water or big surf, we'll take the win. This is the regatta we point to from the beginning (of the season)," Outrigger coach Tom McTigue added.

Winning 15 of the regatta's 30 events, Outrigger topped the five AA division (16 crews or more) clubs with points to spare.

The six-time defending state champ, leading the regatta from

start to finish, amassed a whopping 99 points in winning its 15th Macfarlane meet in 17 years. Kailua placed second with 49

points, followed by Lanikai with 48. Hui Lanakila topped the seven A division (15 crews or less) clubs with 19 points. Kai Oni was second with 14 points and Waimanalo third with 13 points.

The once-tied (by Kailua at Na-nakuli last month) Outrigger remains unbeaten in Oahu Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association competi-

tion over two seasons.

Outrigger was more than ready to win its own regatta, the fifth meet of the seven-race OHCRA

"The Macfarlane is steeped in tradition. Our paddlers know this. They rose to the occasion," McTigue said.

Some say OCC takes the Macfarlane race more seriously than it does the state championship.

"We begin the regatta day with a crew breakfast. We explain to our paddlers about the tradition and what the Macfarlane race means to Outrigger," McTigue said.

Walter J. Macfarlane was Outrigger Canoe Club's president during its critical building years prior

to World War II.

"He was instrumental in perpetuating all Hawaiian water sports, including paddling. He helped bring them to the level they are today," Macfarlane's grandson, Macfarlane's grandson, Walter Guild, said.

Guild paddled in OCC's winning senior men's canoe as the club swept the senior, sophomore, open 4 and 18s events in the men's and women's divisions.

"Placing first in the senior men's race, with all its history, is almost as important as winning the regatta itself," said Outrigger steersman Todd Bradley. Lanikai came in

second, followed by Hui Nalu Remarked Coach Beanie Heen of Kailua Canoe Club: "No one was going to beat Outrigger at their own regatta today. Winning here is their focus."

Heen used the Macfarlane race as a training session for more important races to come.

'I'm not making excuses. would love to have won this regatta. But I also wanted to give all my paddlers - regardless of experience - an opportunity to race."

Kailua qualified for all 30 events while Outrigger and Healani had 28 crews and Lanikai 23. With only seven lanes for racing at Waikiki

instead of 14 used in other regattas — crews must qualify by placing high in the regattas leading up to July 4.

After 13 races, Outrigger led second place Lanikai 29-24. Through 25 events, Outrigger's lead soared to 81-47.

'We're not disappointed. Our club morale is higher than it ever has been," said Lanikai coach Bobby Puakea.

Lanikai clung to second place until the last two events when Kailua scored five points for its women's masters win and one point for fourth place in men's masters.

"Outrigger provides inspiration," said Puakea. "Our paddlers want to beat the best, if not on club points then with individual crew wins." Lanikai won three races the men's freshman and junior and girls' 13s.

After five OHCRA races, Outrigger's girls' 16s, boys' 18s, sophomore men and senior women remain unbeaten. Healani's boys' 13s and 16s are also undefeated.

OHCRA racing resumes July 14 with the John Kaupiko Regatta, followed one week later by the Oahu Championships. Both events start at the Kaneohe Marine Corps Air Station at 8:30 a.m..

The state championship is scheduled for Aug. 3 at Hilo Bay.
