Outrigger surfs back into first at Macfarlane Regatta

Outrigger Canoe Club served notice yesterday that it is ready to regain its place as the top Oahu Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association club, easily winning the 43rd annual Walter J. Macfarlane Regatta at Waikiki Beach.

Outrigger won eight of 30 events and scored 86 points, easily outdistancing Hui Nalu (71), Kailua (48) and Healani (44).

Kailua had won the first four regattas of the season, including a 23-point smashing of Outrigger last week in the Waimanalo Regatta.

While Outrigger's victory yesterday was decisive, it came in what has been called "a surfing contest."

While most canoe races are held in the open ocean, races in the Macfarlane Regatta are held from the beach to the open ocean and back, allowing some canoes to catch waves on their way into shore.

"We're not a surfing club, I guess," said Beanie Heen, Kailua's assistant coach. "I don't think we have ever taken this race seriously. It's more of a fun race for us. We try to use everybody in this race who we

don't use in other races so everyone gets a chance to race. We do it every year.

"On the Windward side there's no surf at all — it's just wind surf not really wave surf," he continued. "It doesn't seem like it the way Outrigger is moving, but to us it's a lucky-luck race."

Darryl Hara, Hui Nalu's coach, also didn't seem too surprised by the day's outcome.

"Actually, it doesn't really surprise me too much. There's only really two clubs out here that have steersmen that can handle the waves real well, and that to me is Outrigger and Hui Nalu.

"A couple of the other clubs have steersmen that they can use but I think Outrigger is able to spread the work among a number of steersmen... and we're able to do that, too."

Outrigger also has experience, tradition and a certain mystique Or, as Hara calls it, magic.

"Outrigger always seems to be in the right place to catch waves in this race. It's uncanny how they're able to (be) in the

right place, even if they have a bad lane. There always seems to be a magical wave that comes through for them."

Outrigger coach Mike Fox admitted to some advantage with the type of conditions, but he had another explanation for his club's turnaround.

"Just hard work and lots of spirit," he said. "That's really it.

"We've been hungry after losing four races and I think even if there wasn't surf today we would be showing very strongly.

"Our younger kids, our 12s, 13s and 14s, did very well. We've scratched (in) a bunch of kids' races in the last few regattas. We entered every race today and that really helped us, having our depth back."

Fox wasn't aware of Kailua's poor showings in previous years in this race. He was more concerned with his team's recent 27-point loss.

"I'm not much of a historian,"
