

MOLOKAI-WAIKIKI RACE DETAILS

When we went to press in November it was not possible to get the names of all of the canoe crews. For the records we are giving this information now.

Winning crew from Molokai: William Wainui, William Foster, Abe Bowman, crew captain, William Ahyce, Ulysses Puaa and Charles Titcomb. Canoe used was loaned by Doris Duke Cromwell.

Originally the Molokai Race was planned by the Molokai Hawaiian Civic Club, however they had no canoe committee at that time so a group of Molokai men were brought together through the efforts of "Toots" Minvielle. This group has no official organization as yet, but are in the process of forming their own club at the present time.

Proposer and promoter of the event was Albert E. "Toots" Minvielle who acted as starter. David G. "Dad" Center, acted as timer and judge. Sponsors were; Hawaiian Canoe Racing and Surfing Association and the Aloha Week Committee. Minvielle acted as chairman. It was an additional event, planned by the Aloha Week Committee as part of Aloha Week.

The Aloha Week Committee, represented by President, Harry Palmer, was on hand at the time the canoes came in. The Moana Hotel table was set up by member Henry Lee. Eggnogs were previously ordered and brought out by Harry C. Nordmark, assisted by Les Van Nostrand.
