

# Paddlers Win Distance Races

Club paddlers turned in outstanding performances in the distance races during August, with the men capturing the Duke Kahanamoku and Queen Liliuokalani Races, and the women winning the Dad Center Race.

## Duke Kahanamoku Race

Outrigger men won the 23rd annual Duke Kahanamoku Long Distance Race on August 19, on the resurrected 23-mile course from Kailua Beach to Ft. DeRussy in 2:58:26.

The winning crew was Chris Kincaid, Tom McTigue, Walter Guild, Geoff Graf, Courtney Seto, Kainoa Downing, Todd Bradley, Mark Rigg and Grady Bintliff.

Outrigger's second crew finished fifth overall in 3:15:03.

The masters crew finished 21st overall and fifth in masters in a time of 3:35:15.

The senior masters dropped out of the race after damaging the ama on their canoe in the heavy surf.

In the women's six-mile race from Ft. DeRussy to Diamond Head and back, Outrigger wahines finished second to Healani in :50:18.51, third in :50:23.56, 12th in :55:38.73 and 15th in :56:04.18.

The masters crews finished 22nd and 30th overall, and 4th and 7th in the masters divisions. The first masters crew finished the course in :57:32.63 and the second masters crew was timed in :59:47.96.

## Dad Center Race

OCC captured the 16th annual Dad Center Race on August 26, covering the 21.6 miles from Kailua Beach Park to the OCC beach in 3 hours, 33 minutes and 34.84 seconds.

## Queen Liliuokalani Long Distance Races

OCC men won the 19th annual Steinlager Queen Liliuokalani World Championship Long Distance Canoe Races in Kailua-Kona on September 1 and the women finished second.

The women raced 18 miles from Kailua to Honaunau and the men raced the return course from Honaunau to Kailua.

The first women's crew finished second overall and first in koa in 2:15:46, and the second open crew was in 15th in 2:27:43. OCC entered a masters crew for the first time and they finished 47th overall and 4th in glass in 2:34:35.

The men were first to finish and also won the koa division in 1:58:50. The second open crew finished seventh in 2:05:02. The masters finished 10th overall and won their division in 2:08:34. The senior masters were second in their division in 2:23:06.
