


## **NA WAHINE RACE 2009**

Throughout this summer's canoe racing season, Coaches John Puakea and Liz Perry spread Outrigger's veteran wahine paddlers among three crews of relative novices and younger talent. The carefully crafted formula kept Outrigger in the top five slots of the open, masters, and koa divisions of racing.

The annual Na Wahine O Ke Kai race from Molokai to Oahu was held September 28, with some of the best conditions in years. Strong trades blowing all weekend and a rising tide made for good surfing conditions.

Last year, OCC Masters finished fourth overall. This year, three members of the 2008 crew returned to lead new (two had never raced Molokai before) and younger crewmates, and still Outrigger finished an impressive fifth of the 84 crews that entered. Since the inception of the


Na Wahine race more than 30 years ago, Outrigger's women have consistently placed in the top five every year.
