Outrigger Canoe Club paddlers made a strong showing at the Oahu Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association and Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association championship regattas, the Club's best in recent years.

"The 2014 regatta season has been a great success," said Canoe Racing Committee Chair Keahi Pelayo. "OCC raced 40 of 41 races every weekend, and we had seven State Championship Crews (as compared to two in 2013 and zero in 2012).

"Our member participation level was the highest it has been in many, many years. A solid foundation of paddlers, coaches, canoe committee members and supporters were put in place, meaning this year has been a huge step toward our goal of becoming one of the preeminent canoe paddling programs in the world," he added.

Youth crews, under the leadership of Mike Lum, had an outstanding season.

"Our paddling season started in February with the preseason long distance races and practices for our older youth crews," Lum said. "We participated in races off Waikiki, Sand Island and Kailua and both boys and girls did a great job paddling and finding success in their respective divisions.

"Taking a look back at our season, we started off very strong winning seven age group events at the Clement Paia Regatta. Our coaching staff was very happy with the results and garnering successes by winning their age groups at the weekly regattas or by medaling. We saw them having fun in the process and really working hard at each practice.

"All of our youth paddlers are to be congratulated. We qualified 12 of 13 crews for the state championships. Congratulations to the Boys 15 and 18 crews who each brought home a Gold Medal," he added.

Other winning crews were the Novice Women B, the Women 50, Men 55, Men 60 and Men 65.

With regatta season behind us, our upper division crews have turned to distance, gearing up for the Na Wahine O Ke Kai on September 21, and the Molokai Hoe on October 12.

This year we have two junior boys crews doing distance and setting their sights on racing the Molokai Hoe, hoping to defend the 18 & under division title they won last year. We also have a junior girls crew which has been training side by side with the boys on weekend training runs. They were hoping to enter a girls 16-18 crew in the Dad Center Long Distance Race in late August.

Many thanks to all of the volunteers who donated so many hours of their time to making our paddling program a success: the coaches, the boat holders, the registrars, the Canoe Racing Committee, and all the parents and members who supported the program.
