# Regatta Season Comes to an End

The work of rebuilding the Outrigger Canoe Club paddling program continued in 2015 with the best showing in the past 10 years.

"I'd like to thank Keahi Pelayo who started the rebuilding effort two years ago," said Canoe Racing Committee Chair Tom McTigue. "This year's CRC committee, Head Coach Guy Wilding and our coaches worked as a cohesive team to lead our paddlers to a great season.

Paddlers won 71 Gold Medals this year through the eight regattas, capping the season with a third place finish in the HCRA State Championship Regatta on August 1 in rainy Hilo.

"We've patterned our program on the Positive Coaching Alliance program and I'm very proud of how our paddlers and coaches conducted themselves this year," McTique added.

Although the OCC finished in second or third place point-wise in the regattas, our crews had an excellent performance with 12 crews winning their races at the Paiaina, King Kamehameha and Kaupiko Regattas, and 10 winning crews at Waimanalo and OHCRA.

Another highlight of the season was the OCC Senior Women who won their first seven races, going undefeated for the first time since 1977. Their winning streak was broken at States with a second place finish.

Congratulations also to the Novice A crew. Most of the ladies in that crew won Gold Medals as Novice B's last year and repeated as Novice A's this year. The crew includes Natasha Haine, Britta Bourne, Tina Larson, Ginger Lunt, Jennifer Fratzke, Jordan Everett, Tiffany Rabacal, Kristina Larson, Jen Kilpatrick and Marie Martel.

Our other Gold Medal crew at States was the Masters 60 women. Three members of that crew have been paddling for four decades and are still bringing home the Golds: Kaiulu Downing, Tiare Richert-Finney and Michele St. John. Other members of the crew were Alice Lunt, Laurie Lawson and Kim Darling.

We were able to win events this year, but not being able to field crews in every event hurt our final point standing.

One of the Club's weak areas was the lack of novice paddlers. In a Club our size, it's hard to find people who have never paddled before which is a requirement for Novice B. The Board of Directors is cognizant of the problem and will be working with the Canoe Racing Committee on the issue before next season.

Congratulations to all of our paddlers for their successful season, mahalo to all the coaches and committee members who contributed so much time and effort to make the season a success, and to the members who supported the paddling program.

While the 'Junior Riggers head back to school, many of the adult paddlers will begin competing in the long-distance season which will culminate with the 40.8 mile Na Wahine O Ke Kai race from Molokai to Oahu on September 27 followed by the Molokai Hoe on October 11.
