Surfers Triumph In Men, Women Blue Ribbon Events

KAILUA, Kona, Hawaii, July 25—The Waikiki Surf Club won the Julian Yates Hawaiian Canoe Racing championship regatta here today.

The Surfers scored 18 points as against 17 by the Outrigger Canoe Club, the defending champions. Hui Nalu registered 10 points and Hui Kalia and Kai Opua nine each. Healani tallied five points, Honauanu four. Koolaupoko failed

to score. A large crowd of 9,000 witnessed the colorful regatta and ceremonies which were highlighted by a parade from the Kona Im to the pier. At the head of the parade were Lorrin P. Thurston grand marshal for the day ton, grand marshal for the day, and John Lind, president of the Hawaiian Canoe Racing and Surfing Association.

The Hawaii County Band also participated in the parade, with baton twirling girls giving a fine performance. Then came the officials of the canoe association and the paddlers themselves.

Just before the races got under way, Grand Marshal Thurston re-viewed the history of canoe rac-ing in Kona.

In dislodging the Outrigger Canoe Club as champions of the championship regatta, the Waikiki Surf Club won the men's senior six, women's senior six, novice six, and boys 17 and under.

In the blue ribbon senior men's six race, Waikiki won about 5 lengths over Hui Nalu. Their time for the three mile grind was 26 minutes 29.6 seconds. The Nalus were timed at 26 minutes 55.6. Honaunau was third.

Showing great improvement over their past races in Honolulu, Hui Nalu led at the first turn. But Waikiki rallied to move slightly ahead on the second turn. The Surf Club crew, although challenged by Hui Nalu, managed to pull away steadily. They were ahead by two lengths at the third turn.
