LIHUE, Kauai-The Outrigger Canoe Club of Honolulu rolled up 45 points yesterday to win the State canoe paddling championship at Nawiliwili harbor.

Waikiki was second with 29 points and Healani finished third with 24.

Lanikai tallied 16. Hui Nalu 10, Kauai five and Maile three.

The races were delayed almost an hour while the officials debated two protests and were faced with a threat of a mass withdrawal from the events.

At the start of the halfmile men's novice race, the Outrigger crew got off to a bad start because of an alleged broken paddle. Healani won but the judges allowed an Outrigger protest.

But when the race was restarted, only the OCC canoe

came to the starting line and paddled the course in solitary splendor.

The other clubs charged the OCC paddle was deliberately broken in order to force the rerun. The judges thereupon reversed themselves and allowed the Healani victory to stand.
