

# Three-Way Tie In Canoe Regatta

**HILLO, Hawaii**—Healani, Outrigger Canoe Club and Kailua Hawaiian Civic Club wound up in a three-way tie for the 1965 Hawaii State canoe regatta championship yesterday, each scoring 26 points.

This is the first three-way finish in the history of the Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association classic which was held before an estimated 5,000 persons in Hilo Bay.

The 1965 competition honored former Big Island legislator, civic leader and airline official Clifford H. Bowman.

Following the three deadlocked teams were Waikiki Surf Club with 21 points, Lanikai 11, Kauai 10 and Kamehameha of Hilo 1.

Two records were broken in the meet, one each by the Outrigger boys 14 and under crew and the other by the Waikiki Surf novice men paddlers.

The OCC boys crew was clocked in 1:58.5 to shatter the 1964 record of 2:06.3 set by Healani. Waikiki Surf's new record for the novice men one-half mile distance is 4:02.2, topping the 4:04.8 time turned in by Kauai in 1963.

The races were conducted by HCRA race committee chairman John Kapua with association president David K. Bent as coordinator.

Ed Carter, tournament director for the Hawaiian Open, also is tournament director for the PGA event, and is expected to contact all the players during the week about the possibility of competing here.

ready have been received from Bill Casper, the second-leading money-winner of all time; PGA champion Bobby Nichols, former national Open champion Gene Littler, former PGA champions Jay and Lionel Hebert; ex-Open king Ken Venturi, Dave Marr; Homer Blancas, the leading rookie of the year; Juan (Chi Chi) Rodriguez and others.

There has been no decision yet from Jack Nicklaus and Arnold Palmer on whether they will compete here.
