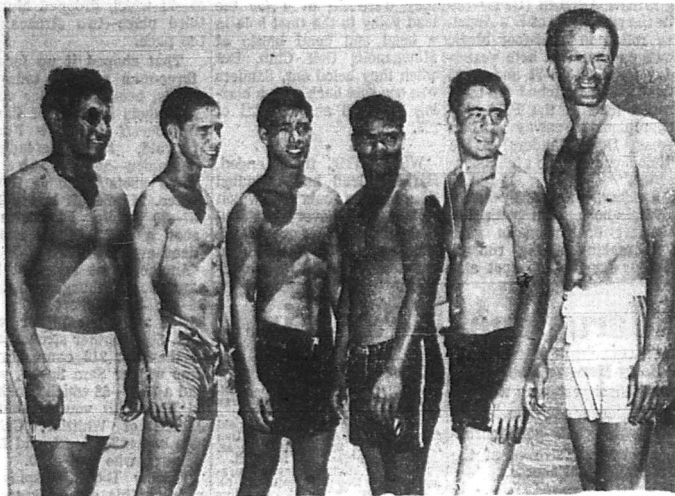


Outrigger Club Wins Canoe Racing Title

Coach George Downing's Outrigger Canoe Club paddlers won the first annual 50th State canoe regatta racing championship yesterday in an 11-event program at Keehi Lagoon.

The OCC crews, who also copped the Oahu title two weeks ago, scored a narrow victory yesterday. They racked up 37 points and gained only four first places. Kai Oni from Windward Oahu was second with 28 points and right behind in third place with 27 was Waikiki Surf Club.

Healani had 12 followed by Lanikai 7, Hui Nalu 4, Kauai and Kai Opua 3 apiece and Holomua failed to score a point.

TWO RECORDS were in the season's final canoe competition which attracted an estimated 5,000 persons.

Outrigger won the boys 14 and under quarter mile race with a new time of 2:14.2 to better its own mark of 2:17.0 set earlier this year. Second place Hui Nalu also bettered the mark with a time of 2:15.0.

Healani's girls novice crew finished the half mile distance with a new clocking of 4:19.3. Outrigger also was under the record at 4:25.5. The OCC team last year turned in a time of 5:01.2.

The regatta, sponsored and conducted by the Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association, honored Governor William F. Quinn as the 50th State's first elected top executive.

Paul Jones was in charge of the race committee.

Paddlers and coaches climaxed the regatta with a luau last night at the Ala Moana Hawaiian Village where the awards were presented.
