KAWAIHAE. Hawaii - Kawaihae Canoe Club staved off a late rally by defending champion Kai O Pua of Kailua-Kona Saturday to win the Moku O Hawaii Canoe Racing Association championship.

Kawaihae finished with 71 points to Kai O Pua's 70. Kai O Pua won three of the last four races to drastically cut its defi-
