Outrigger trumps Kailua, wins OHCRA title

OCC finished the OHCRA season with 4-3 dge in regatta victories over Kailua Canoe lub. Last week, Kailua beat OCC by 24 points. resterday, OCC finished with 88 points to Kaiua's 80. Hui Nalu was third with 58.

Yesterday's winning teams qualified for the tate championships, Aug. 2 in Hilo. The next hree teams in each division, based on cumulaive points during the season, also qualified.

OCC will be shooting for its third consecutive tate championship.

Yesterday, it denied Kailua, which won the HCRA title in 1984, with a quick shuffle that ame up all aces.

"They paddled a really smart race," Kailua each Kathy Erwin said. "I don't know what

Erwin's small nephew looked up and spoke. "You look like you're ready for a beer,

Three of those changes gave Outrigger points in divisions where it is usually blanked, Haine said. One was particularly satisfying.

OCC's junior masters team was swapped into the men's sophomore division and won. "That was a sweet victory," Haine said. "Those guys who are over 35 were able to compete in what is usually a 25-year-old age group."
