Kailua Outpaddles Outrigger for Title

Kailua Canoe Club staged a coup and upended Outrigger Canoe Club for the first time this season—and doing it when it really counted. The Windward upstarts garnered approximately seven points more than previously undefeated OCC yesterday in capturing the Oahu Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association's Oahu championship regatta at Keehi Lagoon.

Official point totals were not released following a controversial senior women's race, however, race director Mary Serrao indicated that Kailua was the clear winner of the team championship with OCC finishing second and Hui Nalu third. Serrao said the race rules committee would meet to review a protest and an appeal involving a Hui Nalu paddler who competed in both the sophomore and senior women's events.

Apparently the association has contradictory rules on crew members' eligibility to step up and participate in more than one upper-division event at the same regatta.

AN EXCITED Joan Malama, first vice president and board member of Kailua Canoe Club, saluted the group's head coach, Harrison "Beanie" Heen. "He made some strategic moves of personnel at the right times, and it all came together. Today we're really proud of him."

Malama described how Harrison, former assistant and women's distance coach for Kallua, shifted upper-division padidlers into key open events. "He did some shrewd things." Malama said. "The most important thing is he used some senior Kauai.

men and women in the open-4 men, open-4 women and mixed races. They were very strategic moves for us."

The changes nailed victories in those events for valuable team points, as well as assured those crews of automatic qualification for the Aug. 4 state championships at Hanalei, Kauai.

"OUR 16-AND-UNDER boys went out and won today, too," Malama added. "That was very important and really psyched the club up. The boys got together late in the season. They didn't even paddle in the first two or three regattas, so they were two months behind the crews they were paddling against. It takes a while to really paddle together and gel. We knew they were strong boys and had the talent.

"The coaches feel we're peaking at the right time, and we'll try to maintain the gains we made this week and carry them over to state's." Malama said. She recalled that Kailua last claimed a team state title in the mid-70s. "It's our turn again. . ."

Despite "losing" the Oahu title, Outrigger qualified the highest number of crews for the state championships. Yesterday's winners gained an au tomatic berth for the event two weeks from now with the other three spots allotted to OHCRA crews based on overall performance this season.

OCC will be among the favorites to capture the state title, along with defending champion Hui Nalu and Hui Wa'a's newly-crowned champ Lokahi. Lokahi outpointed Kaneohe, 73-64, Saturday at Kaneohe to win that association's title and automatically qualify seven of its crews for
