Kailua outpoints OCC, 72-70, to win OHCRA championship

A long wait finally ended.

Kailua Canoe Club, relying on key strategic moves, held off Outrigger Canoe Club yesterday to win the Oahu Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association championship regatta in Keehi Lagoon.

Kailua, a 200-member club, scored 72 points to win its first regatta of the season. Outrigger was second with 70 points and Hui Nalu third with

Because of a protest filed by Hui Nalu, results of the women's senior race were stricken from the standings and all point totals deemed unofficial.

The protest, though, will not affect the outcome of the regatta.

"I don't know how to feel . . . I don't know how to react," said Kailua coach Beanie Heen, whose club had not won an OHCRA title since

1977. "It's been such a long time. I'm just so happy."

Said Kallua assistant coach Kamoa Kalama: "Outrigger thought it was invincible. But it took a down-home country club to beat someone that's really well established."

Indeed. Outrigger, spurred by its upper-division crews, surpassed Kailua to win each of the previous six regattas. But there would be no comeback for OCC in the championship regatta.

Kailua led Outrigger, 40-23, 60-39, and, after 28 races of the 30-event program, 72-65. In the 29th event, the women's senior, Kailua was awarded first place after Hui Nalu and Outrigger — the top two finishers — were disqualified.

Outrager, which crossed the finish line second, was ousted because its canoe hit a flag while negotiating a turn. Hui Nalu was disquali-

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fied for using the same steersman in two races.

Hui Nalu's Kala Kukea later filed a protest, claiming that a paddler can compete in two races during a championship regatta. The protest will be heard by race officials later this week.

Outrigger, though, cannot benefit from a decision in Hui Nalu's favor, even with its victory

in the men's senior race.

After the regatta, Kailua paddlers unabashedly surrounded their canoe, Kalanakila, and cheered themselves.

"I was in the Kailua Canoe Club about 10 years ago when we won the state championship down in Hilo." senior masters crew member Bill Baldwin said. "This is greater. We expected to

win it then. We had to fight for it here.

"Every regatta they (Outrigger) would come from behind and beat us. This week, we just said, 'They're not going to do it.' We had a little help — we understand that — but we have to have a little help from somebody else. Against a club like Outrigger, if you don't get a little help, you aren't going to win."

Kailua also was aided by several important crew switches. Heen moved paddlers from the senior men's and women's crews to the men's

open-4, women's open-4 and mixed races.

With the transplanted paddlers, Kailua won the open-4 and mixed events for the first time this season.

"We just waited for the real race to do it," Kailua assistant coach Scott Jacobs said of the switches. "It was a championship race and we knew we had to do something to close the gap. Outrigger has been beating us by 10 to 12 points a race."

Ironically. Heen borrowed the tactic from Out-

rigger, which regularly flip-flops crews.

Kailua paddler Mark Ansel said Outrigger has been playing a chess game all year long. We

just wanted to play our game today.

Said Kalama: "It's good to beat them at their own game. We're fortunate to take advantage of it today. They're (Outrigger) a real strong club and they'll be there in the state race. But it's something special for us today, We're going to enjoy it to its fullest."

Winning crews at the OHCRA championship

gained berths in the state regatta, which will be held Aug. 4 in Kauai. The remaining three OHCRA berths for each race were awarded to crews based on their performances during the regular season.

Outrigger placed 25 crews in the state regatta.

Kailua had 24, Hui Nalu 21 and Healani 10.
