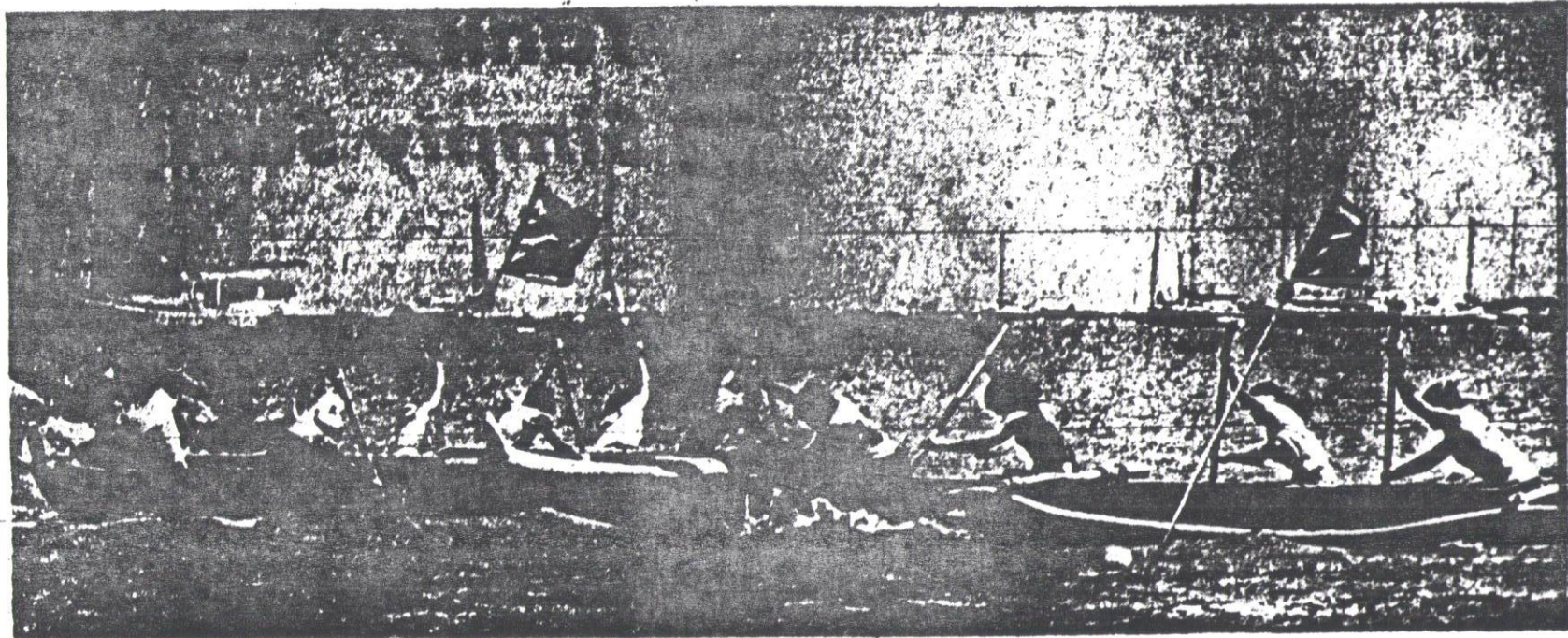


## Telltale Turn

# Second-Half Surge Gives Hui Nalu Oahu Title

"Break up Hui Nalu!" was the chant heard across Keahi Lagoon's windwept waters yesterday as Hui Nalu Canoe Club paddled off with the Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association's Oahu Championship—their third straight regatta win.

"Yes, I'd say it's been a nice day," smiled Hui Nalu CC's President Laura Thompson, as humbly as possible. "Being temporarily on top is fine, but at Hui Nalu, we stress fellowship before winning. But now that I think about it, it's rather nice to have both."

Hui Nalu, displaying strength in

the regatta's second half, won five events and placed second in three of eight other races, for a total of 54 points. Second place Outrigger Canoe Club, winners of only two of the 24 events, scored 41 points.

BUT FOR THE Lanikai, Healan, Hui Lanakila, Waikiki Surf and Kaihau canoe clubs, which placed third through seventh, respectively, competition was intense yesterday. Only a single point separated each of the four clubs.

The pebble-lined shore of Keahi Lagoon Park looked like Tent City, Hawaiian-style, as many colorful sun protecting shelters dotted the race site.

And the noise! Even the roar from the yellers departing from the nearby Honolulu International Airport was muffled by the never-ceasing shouts and cheers from the

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spirited paddlers and spectators.

"The crews got pretty excited," conceded Mel Kalahiki, the meet's race director. "This regatta serves as qualification to the State Championship. To qualify means a lot to

the paddlers and spectators, and it's a pretty loose."

IN ADDITION TO Hui Nalu and Outrigger canoe clubs, nearly every team tasted victory. Healan Canoe Club won three events, including back-to-back races in the Men's Masters and the Mixed Open heats before calling it a day.

Hui Lanakila won four events—the Boys 14 and 15 as well as the men's Novice-B and Junior—while Lanikai Canoe Club stroked to four wins, in three women's races, plus the Men's Open-4.

Waikiki Surf Club and Kailua Canoe Club scored a pair of first

places each, while Honolulu Canoe Club topped the Boy's 13-year-old event.

The regatta's two blue ribbon heats—the men's and women's senior races—were won, as expected, by Hui Nalu (men) and by Waikiki Surf Club (women).

"IN THE SENIOR Men's, we're coming closer," sighed Nat Norfleet, Outrigger Canoe Club's coach. "Hui Nalu beat us only by seven seconds. Just wait, we'll get them."

But the ladies of Waikiki Surf Club really did a job on their rivals, as they beat second place Hui Nalu by a whopping 29 seconds. Shirely Pele-

kai was WSC's winning steersman and Luana Froiseth held the stroking position.

But stealing the hearts of paddlers and spectators yesterday was Waikiki Surf

The six-man crew, consisting of Randy Chun, Kimo Hollinger, Michael Tong, George Downing, Blus Makua, Jr. and Wallace Froiseth, was the most experienced, but oldest, team of canoe paddlers in the regatta. But with all of their knowledge, and their desire, father-time took its toll in the grueling two-mile contest. The veteran crew couldn't compete with the younger men and they finished dead last.
