# OCC Third at Kailua and Makaha

Despite the fact that OCC had only been training for six weeks compared to 2-3 months for some of the clubs, and many of our young athletes are still away attending mainland schools, we managed an impressive third place finish.

Kailua pulled away from second place Healani and OCC, showing once again that they are ready to defend their State Championship title, but the OCC placed in 13 of the 16 races and gained valuable experience. The Novice B men took their first gold medal in three years and the "hot" Senior women's crew of Evie Black, Michele St. John. Connie Maguire, Anne Nicol, [ill Maguire, and Anne Hogan looked ready to repeat as state titlists with an impressive victory. The "Super Sophs," Girls 15 and Girls 17 took seconds while Mens Novice A. Freshman Men, Junior Men, Senior Men, Womens Novice A and Boys 14 took bronze medals. Gaining points for a fourth place finish were the Womens Novice B and Junior Women.

Makaha, June 13th, brought a few surprises, a goodly amount of "hulis" and the second straight sixtypoint total by victorious Kailua over Healani (46) and OCC (40).
