OUTRIGGER CLUB WINS KAILUA CANOE MEET

Outrigger Canoe Club won the men's senior six 2-mile race on September 3rd in the Koolaupoko Lions Club's eighth annual canoe regatta at Kailua Bay.

OCC also won the women's feature senior six half-mile race and the team championship for the two-day meet with 32 points.

Kai Oni followed with 25, Healani 14, Waikiki Surf Club 11, Hilo and Kai Opua of Kona, eight each, Holomua and Lanikai, five each, and Kamehameha of Hilo two.

Outrigger won the men's senior event in 19:42.3 with Kai Opua a good second, Healani was third and Kamehameha fourth.

George Downing was steersman of the victorious senior crew of B. Muirhead, D. O'Connor, M. Auerbach, S. Formes and W. Baird.

Winning time for the OCC women's crew was 5:27.8 with Waikiki Surf second, Kai Opua third and Kai Oni fourth.
