OCC WINS NATIONAL MARITIME DAY CANOE RACES

The OCC is again on top in the outrigger canoe racing field as shown by the practically clean sweep the crews made on National Maritime Day, May 24th. The races sponsored by the Propeller Club were held at Honolulu Harbor and included races for men, women, novices and youngsters.

OCC took seven firsts, two seconds and one fourth, running up a total of 36 points against its nearest opponent, Hui Nalu, who chalked up 14 points. Below are the totals of all Clubs competing together

with a list of all crews.

The remarkable showing is due to a number of elements headed by good coaching by "Dad" Center, ably assisted by Charles Martin and Jack Cross. Other elements were the turnout by a large group of our young men and women, many of whom are novices, their earnest endeavor to condition themselves, the work of Bill Prange and Clyde French, the excellent condition of the canoes due to the work of Whittle, Hollinger and others too numerous to mention. Dr. Charles Lake, trainer, was on the job to examine the paddlers and point out their strengths and weaknesses.

But above all other elements our men and women had what it takes, conditioning, training and THE WILL TO WIN. Some were a bit nervous as it was their first race but when the pressure was on they were able to call upon that spark that only generates when you know you can. To the crews, the coaches, the many volunteer seen and unseen workers the Club members say "WELL DONE" and mahalo nui loa.

And now comes the Kam Day Races on June 11th. The races won were a workout preliminary to a long season. Let us bring back the Blue Ribbon event prize—the Senior six trophy.
