Lanikai wins OHCRA title

Paced by the senior men, it rallies to edge the Kailua and Outrigger canoe clubs

By Catherine Toth Special to the Star-Bulletin After a second-place finish at last year's Oahu Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association Championships, the Lanikai Canoe Club was looking to become the association's top club.

Coming into yesterday's championship at Keehi Lagoon, Lanikai boasted three regatta wins behind the strength of its undefeated senior men. Yesterday, it captured nine of the 32 events to finish with 73 points and edge Kailua Canoe Club and Outrigger Canoe Club by four points.

After the women's senior division race, Lanikai was tied for second with Outrigger and trailed last week's regatta champion, Kailua, which had already posted five wins.

With five points separating first and second place, and 10 events to go, Lanikai needed to take action. And the club's best chance to secure the crown was up next.

The senior men didn't disappoint as they completed the 2-mile race in 14 minutes, 24.68 seconds. Outrigger finished second at 14:32.88.

"We were already locked into the (state championships) in our division," crew member Mike Pedersen said, "but it's always great to go out on a winning note."

Although favored to win their division, the Lanikai senior men were just happy to finish. They nearly flipped over at the final turn, but regained their composure to outdistance Outrigger in a fight-to-the-end finish.

"Today was an example of upwind strength and togetherness," Pedersen said.

"We almost huli-ed (flipped) on that turn," Lanikai's Giovanni Camusa said. "The arm came completely up and that's where we regained our ground. We were dead-even with Outrigger, but we kept our focus, picked up speed and won. That's the high right there."

The team had never paddled together before.

"We have an excellent core of guys," Camusa said, "and today was another example of how we can mix it up with different guys of high caliber and make it exciting."

Lanikai went on to win the women's fours and the men's and women's mixed events to surpass Kailua for the crown.

Defending champion Outrigger held onto second place with the help of first-place finishes by seven teams, including the senior women, who surprised the field with their victory.

"Healani, Hui Nalu and Kailua had their good crews in there," crew member Donna Kahakui said. "So we knew it was going to be a battle and we just prevailed."

Like Lanikai's senior men's team, Outrigger's senior women's crew, which finished the 112-mile race in 12:25.80, never trained together during the regatta season.

"It was like 'Dial-A-Crew' every week," Kahakui said. "But we've paddled together for so long and so often over the past six years that when you put us together, we have the confidence to paddle together. And that's what we did and it was really nice."

Teammate Nicole Wilcox felt confident about the race.

"Everything just went right," Wilcox said. "Everything clicked and it felt good the whole time. We pulled away on the upwind and going downwind felt good, too. Everything just went well for us."

"It takes all six to win," Kahakui added. "You have one weak link and it's all over."

Despite taking first, Outrigger's senior women didn't qualify for the state championships, to be held in two weeks. A rule change implemented this season states that qualifiers are not determined by wins, but by total accumulated points throughout the season. So instead, Hui Nalu, Kailua, Healani and Lanikai will participate in the state championships in the division.

"Unfortunately for us, the rules changed," Kahakui said. "Because of the mix-match, we never had this crew together, so it looks like we're not going to the states."
