So they came up with the idea of having a party and inviting all the "old-timers." Invitations were sent to everyone they could think of from the "Old Club," and non-members were allowed to send in their ticket money; scrip was sold for drinks. People came from all over O`ahu, the Neighbor Islands and the Mainland. They brought their guitars and ukulele to contribute to the great entertainment.

The event was such a smashing hit that everyone wanted them to do it again. And so they did! For years and years, old-timers like Brownie, Rita Fuller, Blondie Boyd, Peter Nottage, ML O'Brien, Paul Dolan and many others worked hard to help Joy and Bill with the numerous details that contributed to the fabulous evening. After five years, however, the Barnhart's were ready to call it quits but the attendees wouldn't hear of it. The author then took over for the next seven years, with the help of a large and eager committee. Each year it continued to bring back waves of nostalgia like a 50-year high school class reunion, with people seeing old friends they hadn't seen in years.

The original price of \$20 has increased only five dollars; the ono buffet, which includes mahimahi, stew and rice, salad and desserts, is the same. Invitations are still sent out and scrip is still available for drinks. They still bring their guitars and ukulele, and Ivanelle Choy, and many others who danced at the very first get-together, still entertain with their special hula.
