Extra credit goes to Eric Lau and John Wacker, who I'm thinking ate a special iron man breakfast before the race. Eric swam 13 minutes faster and John was over 14 minutes faster this year. Congratulations Eric and John!

And, a super special shout out to two swimmers who swim in holy water. Blake Johnson for placing first in the men's 76-80 year old division, and Ron Haworth for finishing first in the men's 81-85 year old age group. These swimmers are an inspiration to us all and prove yet again that you can keep on swimming and living it large no matter what your age.
