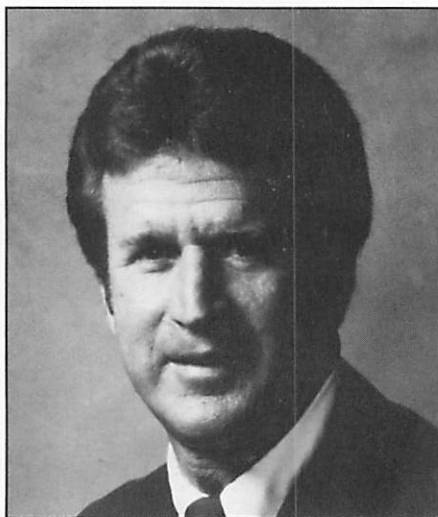
Activities will begin early in the morning and continue into the evening hours. Your participation is encouraged, whether you are a competitor or a cheerleader.
