Subject: Review of Athletic Activities - 1963-64

Under the co-chairmanship of Fred Noa and Nat Norfleet, Jr., the 1963 volleyball season was outstanding. The beach tournaments, sponsored by the Outrigger Canoe Club, started in June and had an excellent turnout of local players from all parts of the city. The climax was the men's doubles championship which was held in August with a turnout of 21 teams from California and Hawaii. The finals of this tournament was one of the best matches played in Hawaii with well over 300 spectators.

Under the coaching of Rabbit Kekai, the Outrigger Canoe Club won the 1963 Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association team championship in Hilo, also did well at the Kailua Bay meet as well as the club-sponsored Walter MacFarland Regatta. The new fiberglass racing canoe and the repair of the koa racing canoes, Kakina and Hanakioke, will be of tremendous use in races as well as in practice this year.

The two club commercial canoes, the Royal Hawaiian and the Surfrider, are now up for sale and monies from these canoes will be placed toward the purchase of Sun Fish sailboards.

For members who enjoy swimming and sunning, approval has been made for the construction of a club raft which should be in the water within the very near future.

This year, the Outrigger Canoe Club and the California Catamaran Association are co-sponsoring a California-to-Hawaii catamaran race starting July 4th. Four cats from California have already entered with the promise of at least three more entries.

provide a Richard Muirhead Memorial Trophy for the first cat to finish;


fastest passage, the Los Angeles Herald Examiner Trophy;
