Thad was born in Hawaii and graduated from Roosevelt High School. He joined Outrigger Canoe Club in 1930, with Duke Kahanamoku as his sponsor. Duke took Thad under his wing and coached him in paddling and other water sports. He was known then as one of "Duke's Boys". He remembers seeing our founder Alexander Hume Ford around the Outrigger in his early years as a member.

Thad participated in canoe paddling, volleyball and surfing in his youth and continued in these activities for many years. He remembers his first big canoe race in 1943. His crew consisted of Tom Arnott, Bob Bush, Jim Fernie, Thad, John Beaumont and Duke. This crew won in the 4- mile race that day paddling in the Leilani. He was friends with, and spent a lot of time with, the legendary beach boys, most of whom have passed on by now.

Thad has spent a lifetime serving, growing with and changing with the Outrigger Canoe Club as it has developed over the years. We feel that it is only fitting and proper that he be honored by being named as a Life Member of this Club.

She has contributed spiritually, emotionally and financially to the

races annually.

She is a generous contributor to the Outrigger Duke Kahanamoku Foundation, specifically designating funds to insure that the Outrigger Canoe Club's 4th of July Race is the premier Hawaiian Canoe Regatta in the State of Hawaii. The race was first conducted in the Waikiki ocean waters on July 4, 1943.

She has donated numerous trophies to help keep the history of the race and canoe paddling alive. In 1999, a new perpetual trophy consisting of a silver bowl on a koa stand was donated by her to the winning women senior six crew in the Walter Macfarlane Memorial Canoe Races.

She is a great friend to all our OCC athletes, as well as athletes state-wide through her generous donations to the Outrigger Duke Kahanamoku Foundation in support of all athletic activities.

Although deserving for many years, she has just become eligible for this honor designating her as a Life member.
