ODKF Awards Final Athletic Grants for 1996-97

The Outrigger Duke Kahanamoku Foundation has announced its final quarter grant awards for 1997. The following grants were made:

- •\$1,000 to the Cline Mann Paddleboard Race scheduled for August 9. Funds for this event come from the ODKF Designated Cline Mann Fund, named for Hawaiian waterman John Cline Mann who died in September 1996. Funds are restricted to water related activities. An article about this event will appear in the August issue of the Outrigger.
- •\$5,000 to the July 4th
 Macfarlane Regatta held every 4th of
 July in Waikiki and named for Walter
 Macfarlane. The premier summer
 canoe regatta is open to 15 clubs and
 nearly 4,000 paddlers on the beach at
 Waikiki. Funds for this event come
 from the Muriel Macfarlane Flanders
 Fund, established to honor Duke
 Kahanamoku and canoe paddling.
- •\$500 to Mahealani Lum to attend the Junior World Kayaking Trials in Atlanta, Georgia. An outstanding paddler, volleyball player and kayaker, the Kamehameha Senior will attend college in San Diego in September. Her goal is to make the 2000 Olympic Kayak Team.

For the second year, Lum's grant comes from the designated Kala Kukea Fund, established by the friends and family of Kala Kukea, water sportsman and fireman who died in 1996. Kukea was Lum's coach on the Hawaii Canoe & Kayak Team.

Of interest to OCC members are these other grants:

- •\$1,000 to the ASICS Jr.
 Rainbow Girls 16 Volleyball Team,
 coached by Dennis Berg. The grant
 will assist the teams with funds to
 attend the U.S. Junior National
 Championships in June in Denver,
 Colorado. Ranked number one in 16
 and under, they have won all of the
 16's tournaments they have entered.
 Members of the team attend Pearl
 City, Kahuku, Kamehameha,
 Punahou, University Lab, Maryknoll
 and Roosevelt high schools.
- •\$1,000 to the Lanikai Canoe Club to assist with the Duke Kahanamoku Long Distance Canoe Race scheduled for August 17. This is the fourth year ODKF has assisted Lanikai with this race which is 25 miles long, from Lanikai to the Duke Kahanamoku Beach in Waikiki. This will be the 30th anniversary of the event. Many OCC paddlers participate in this distance canoe race.

•\$1,300 in additional grants were given to three people on the Big Island, one on Kauai, one from Kaimuki, and a body surfing team from Oahu.

The Outrigger Duke Kahanamoku Foundation is the only foundation devoted to grants and scholarships for athletes. ODKF has given 115 scholarships for a total of \$110,000 and \$169,309 to 155 individuals and teams since 1986. A total of \$279,309 has been distributed to Hawai'i's athletes by this 11 year old foundation.
