
Koa Ostrem Wins Daddy Haine Scholarship

Koa's scholarship comes from the Tom "Daddy" Haine Endowment Fund, which was established by the ODKF upon the death of Tom Haine, who was OCC Board Secretary, and member of the ODKF Athletic Grant Committee at the time of his death in 1994. The memorial donations made by the many friends of the Haine Family enable the Foundation to give grants and scholarships to outstanding volleyball players like Koa.

Koa says volleyball and OCC have been a part of his life ever since he can remember. In the sixth grade he traveled to Chicago to the AAU national 12 and under tournament.

A recent Punahou graduate,

Koa has been active in school with community work and peer counseling, plus some pretty respectable grades. He will attend UCLA in September.

Named the State Volleyball Player of the Year for 1996, the 1996 ILH Player of the Year for Punahou School, Athlete of the Week for the Honolulu Advertiser, and a host of volleyball championships for the past several years, he was the Captain of his Punahou State Championship team this year.

This young man credits his close extended family for their support of his athletic and academic achievements, feeling that they were always there to help him accomplish his goals. He says "I am an Ostrem, which can't be explained."

Last month the foundation gave the first Tom "Daddy" Haine athletic grant to Lee LeGrand who is playing on the professional volleyball circuit.

Koa's scholarship was one of 20 given by ODKF this year, totaling \$18,000.

ODKF scholarships are given once a year in April. The next application deadline for ODKF athletic grants is August 15.
