

ODKF Auction Slated October 3

With a theme of "Hawaii Then and Now," the Outrigger Duke Kahanamoku Foundation's Action/Auction '86 is scheduled for Friday, October 3 at the Club.

Members of the Auction Committee have been hard at work for months gathering items for the fund raiser. They have been assured of items from a well-known Hawaiian kamaaina collection. Watch for notices around the Club specifically identifying these items.

In addition, the Committee will auction a koa paddle, a mirror allegedly from the Blaisdell Hotel, old Lurline menus, postcards, maps, reproductions of old deeds and other old Hawaiiana items.

One of the hottest items promises to be old Outrigger medals won during the Club's early years.

More modern items to be auctioned include cancelled stamps from the Hokulea voyages, a cruise for thirty aboard the Na Hoku, weekend stays at resort condos, a Korean screen, prints,

books, trips, services, etc.

The Committee will continue to accept items for the auction until September 15. All items donated are tax deductible.

The Auction on October 3 will begin at 6:30 p.m. and feature a variety of delicious pupus and Hawaiian music by Mahi Beamer during the Silent Auction.

Promptly at 7:30 p.m. Honolulu Auctioneer Frank Adolphi will take his place at the podium and begin the auction action.

Bidders will be given programs describing the items when they arrive, as well as a paddle with their number on it to use during the bidding.

Members may charge their purchases to their Outrigger accounts or to a major credit card.

The Foundation is hoping to raise \$30,000 at this year's auction for its scholarship and grant program.

The purpose of the Foundation is to encourage athletes, teams or individuals who are contributing to the growth

and development of sports in Hawaii; to support participation by island athletes in local, national and international competition; to assist in preserving, perpetuating and developing those sports and events which are part of Hawaii's cultural heritage; and to provide scholarships.

Reservations for the Auction may be made at the Front Desk. Tickets are \$35 per person.
