Clean Sweep in '58 Volleyball Season

The Outrigger Canoe Club's return to volleyball prominence in sweeping virtually every major title in the territory has been accredited with the general revival of the sport throughout the island chain.

The volleyball renaissance came under the Red, White and Blue banner of the OCC and in the form of titles in the U. S. Volleyball Association doubles tournament, the Armed Services invitational six-man tourney, and the City-wide Novice six division.

The club's new title trophies represent a clean sweep of the territory's top honors.

And it wasn't a case of a red hot starting combination. Other club entries stuffed the ranking positions in the various tourneys. In the open doubles tourney, the Outrigger placed third and fifth as well as first.

The girls novice six placed third in city-wide parks competition.

With trophy cases bulging, the Outrigger drew its long volleyball season to a close with a victory banquet and cocktail party on the club sundeck December 21.

More than 75 persons turned out to hear six man open coach and master of ceremonies Jim Beardmore and sponsoring director Fred Steere, who made the awards, laud the club's volleyballers.

Trophies were awarded to the winning teams and gold, silver, and bronze volleyballs presented to members of the first, second and third place

teams, respectively, in the annual club championship tourneys.

But the blue ribbon award went to former All-American Tommy Haine and Billy Cross, duked territorial champions in the two man division of modern day volleyball.

Billy Heilbron and Art Lange placed third, Bill Danford and Gil Halpern, both high school students, were the surprise of the U.S.V.B.A. hardcourt tourney in finishing fifth.
