## WA'A KAUKAHI (Single Hull Canoe)

Whether used to voyage across the oceans, race, or for simple fishing and diving, the WA'A (canoe) has a special place in the lives of Native Hawaiians. Here are brief translations of the parts of a Native Hawaiian canoe:

AHA – sennit, cord made of coconut husks or AHO - lashings

AMA – outrigger float

`IAKO – outrigger booms

KAHUNA KALAI WA'A - master canoe building expert

KAUPO'I - median bow cover

KUA MO'O - canoe keel

MANU HOPE - the back of the canoe

MANU IHU - the nose of the canoe

MO'O - the gunnels

NOHO'ANA WA'A - canoe seats

PALI KAI – breakwater on top of the canoe in the front

PEPEIAO - (ear) cleats or attachment points

WA'A KAULUA - double-hull canoe

WAE WA'A - canoe spreader
