

Hosted by the Winged "O," the event acknowledges achievements of OCC athletes. Bill Capp, Winged "O" chairman, gave the opening address; Ron Sorrell was master-of-ceremonies.

Missing this year was a recipient of the prestigious Winged "O" award, since no athlete was deemed worthy of receiving this, the Club's highest honor, Sorrell said.

The John McMahon Perpetual Award for outstanding achievement in surfing went to 11-year-old Heath Hemmings, who also received a Club award for his surfing skills.



## Jan Newhart, World-Class Runner

"I'm getting stronger as I get older!," says Outrigger's world-class, 53-year-old runner, Jan Newhart. She speaks quietly, with a calm certainty and hint of blitheness. Jan also says, with a smile, "When you're a runner you don't try to hide your age."

And why should we ordinary mortals question or even doubt our petite (5'3"), trim (105 lbs.) and attractive masters age-group champion, when she has the records to prove her claim! Despite her uncommon casualness and genuine modesty, I finally prodded her into revealing some of her running accomplishments. The incomplete record shows the following U.S. or world records to date:

**Marathon:** 3-hours 33-minutes, U.S. record for 47-year-old women, 1975.

10,000 Meters: 46-minutes 17-seconds, world and U.S. age-group record, 1978.

**5,000 Meters:** 22-minutes 30-seconds, world and U.S. age-group record, 1978.

**1,500 Meters:** 6-minutes 13.7-seconds, world and U.S. age-group record, 1978.

880 Yards: 3-minutes, U.S. record.

More: Jan has finished the grueling 50-kilometer (32 miles) in 5-hours 33-minutes, owns the 46, 47 and 48-plus years age-group records, and can't recall her other triumphs from one-half mile to 10 kilometers (6.2 miles). We do know that she has run four marathons and two ultra-marathons.

What makes Jan run? Her answers


are interesting. Though always active in athletics—swimming, skating, bicycling, surfing and skiing, "and almost everything that doesn't need 20/20 eyesight (with a chuckle),"—Jan didn't start running until 1973 with Jack Scaff's Marathon Clinic. Like many of us, she remains grateful to running guru Scaff. She is also a member of Johnny Faerber's Flyers, an, elite group of 65 island women who usually dominate women's competition.

Our champion has other unusual physical qualities to sustain her world-class status. How would you like to have a 45-beat-per-minute pulse rate, (normal is 72) and less than 15% body fat, (a normal young lady has 25%)? Jan thinks nothing of running an average of 55 miles per week, increasing to 75 miles before a marathon. She claims that her most creative thinking is accomplished during long training runs. And you, poor reader, think it's boring?

A typical week includes one 14 to 15 miler, five or six other days of 10-mile jogs, some 6 to 8 miles of 220-to-880 intervals on a track, or some "Chop Suey" intervals, meaning speed work without planning but according to whim, mood, desire or perceived strength.

Jan has been an Outrigger member for over eight years, and has lived here for 28 years. She is proud of her three children: Teri Lee, 30; Twain Newhart, 20 (four marathons); and Tracy Ann, 18, (one marathon). Twain and Tracy Ann are both Outrigger members.


