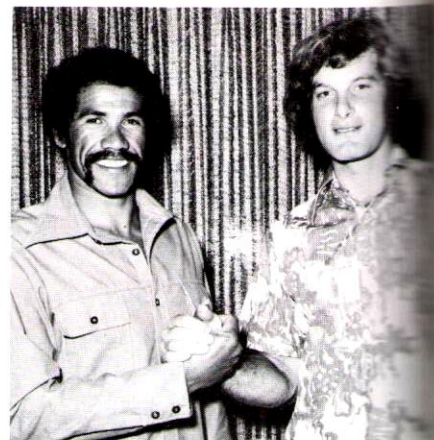

Agenhart Ellis— Man of many “Hats” and many Talents

OCC Assistant Manager, teacher, football coach, duffer, former Hula Bowl tackle—all of these titles belong to Agenhart Ellis.

In the evenings Age Ellis is the Outrigger's capable Assistant Manager, a post he has held since 1967. In the afternoons during football season, he is defensive coordinator for the Farrington High School team, which in 1974 captured the Eastern Division championship of the Oahu Interscholastic Association. Ellis spends his days as a teacher at Farrington High, running a special motivation program for drop-outs and potential drop-outs. Working closely with upwards of 100 students a year, he and his staff are able to counsel and guide about half to diplomas. For Ellis the work is “extremely rewarding.” In his spare time he golfs. (One might ask, *what spare time?!*)

Born and raised in the Islands, Ellis is five-eighths Hawaiian. His pure Hawaiian grandfather, John Hanohano Pa, was one of the last people to swim away from the isolated Kalahele Valley on Kauai.

Age Ellis' first association with the Outrigger dates from childhood, when his father catered annual luaus at the old Club site. In the summer of 1966, while still in college, he joined the OCC staff as security guard.

Ellis is a graduate of Kamehameha School for Boys. He won a football scholarship to the University of Kansas and was fortunate enough to play with Gale Sayers. After a year his father took ill, and he returned to Hawaii. He managed to get another football scholarship at the University of Hawaii, graduating in 1968 with a degree in Business Administration.

Ellis was the University's only representative to the 1967 Hula Bowl, a game in which Bob Griese, Steve Spurrier, Floyd Little, Rockne Freitas, and Don Parker played.

Married, Age lives in Hawaii Kai. His one son, Agenhart Ellis III, is almost two. He and his wife Dorothy, a teacher of Hawaiiana, World Geography, United States History, and Asian American Awareness at St. Andrew's Priory, expect a second child this summer.

Sailors Ahoy! Now hear this:

The following rules and regulations, developed by the Sailing Committee, were ratified by the Board of Directors on November 21, 1973 for inclusion in the Club's House Rules:

1. Boats are to approach and leave the beach to the Diamond Head side of the metal buoy.
2. When entering and leaving the lagoon area, skippers are to remain alert for swimmers and surfers.
3. Whenever possible, boats are to be beached on the Diamond Head end of the beach.
4. Boats beached longer than *fifteen minutes* are required to lower their sails.
5. No boat is to be left on the beach overnight unless permission is granted by the General Manager.
6. Members are responsible for checking their moorings periodically to ensure proper maintenance and ensure that boats are properly moored.
7. Mooring stations will be assigned by the Beach Captain, who will maintain a current and accurate record, and said stations will be under the Beach Captain's control at all times.

8. Boats moored in the Outrigger lagoon are at the risk of the owner, and the Outrigger Canoe Club disclaims all liability.

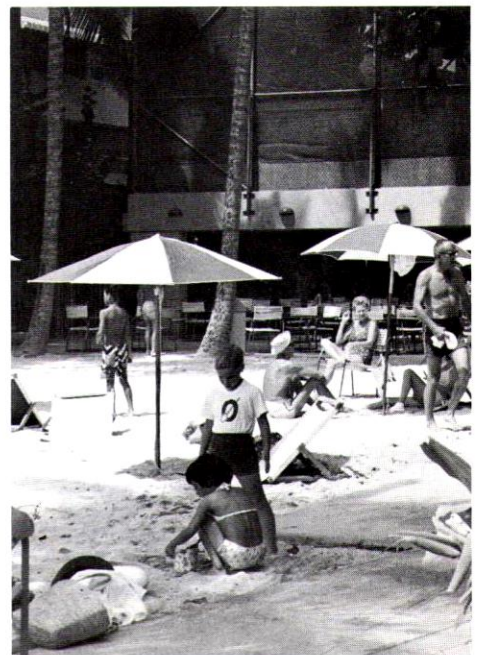
Your observance of these necessary and reasonable rules and regulations will help to make the Outrigger Canoe Club the kind of club we can all enjoy.

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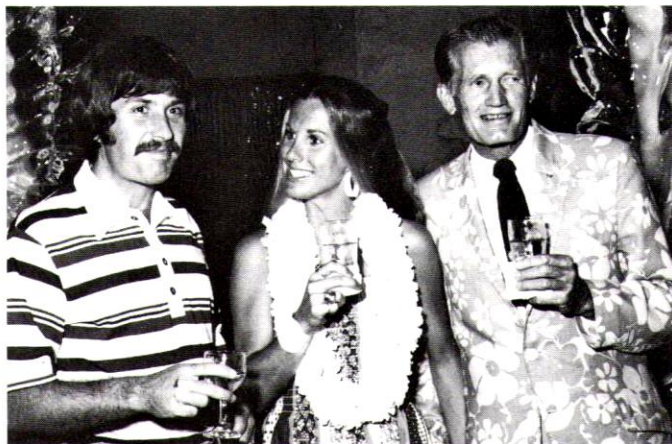
