ANNUAL MACFARLANE FOURTH OF JULY RACES WON BY OUTRIGGER

The Fourth of July, Outrigger Canoe Club, and the Macfarlane Annual Waikiki Canoe Race sponsored by the Club, are all the news. The races were a great success, it was a day of one victory after another. Mark Buck and his crews are to be congratulated for their superb performance that brought the Outrigger its first regatta victory for the July Fourth races in many years. Outrigger just couldn't slow down, winning the first four events in a row. As is usually done in the races at Waikiki, all clubs had the option of open steersmen for this race. We used this option to maximum advantage with Mike Holmes and Fred Hemmings. At the end of the day Fred had steered 5 crews to wins and two new records, one by the Novice men, the other by the Junior girls. In all the Outrigger scored 7 first places for a total of 41 team points, second was Waikiki Surf with 33. Our winning streak started with a superb performance by our 13 Boys, then the 14 Boys, the Novice Girls, followed by the record breaking Novice Men. Our 16 Boys repeated their training escapades and managed to flip the canoe during their turn. Not to be outdone, the 16's bailed and came in 3d. Our Freshmen Girls also placed in the points with a 3d place. The Junior Women really turned on and brought home a record for their half mile event. Our Junior Men with absolutely no advantage of waves as enjoyed by other crews in their event placed third. The heart breaker of the day and the only one, saw the Senior Men finish first across the line in an impressive race only to be disqualified for touching the inside buoy. Their race was nonetheless a beautiful one. Our 18 Boys who are having an excellent season took a fine first place. In the last but not least, in this case, the Freshmen with editor in seat five took a very closely contested first place. The day's events ended with the Open Men's Four in which Outrigger placed second. The day was indeed a high point in the current canoe racing season and one in which all members can be proud.



With these conditions the Outrigger Canoe Club proved its well trained all around ability and again started chalking up victories right from the start. Our 13 Boys with George McPheeters in his first race as steersman brought home a gold medal. Not to be outdone, Aka Hemmings brought his superbly conditioned 14-year-olds into another victory. Our Novice Girls with Heidi Hemmings at the helm brought home a very respectable second place. Our Junior girls brought us but one point with a fourth place finish. Every point counts and the girls did their best. The Outrigger crew of the day who surprised none of us who are regularly at training was the Juniors. There was never any doubt about this crew, they took it from the start and just kept widening the gap until at the finish they had a commanding 5- to 6-boat lead over the next closest, Surf Club. Our Senior Men paddled a beautiful race and I am sure none of us quite know why or how anyone could be much better but nonetheless they finished third. Once again the 18's really turned on in their first race with Brant Ackerman as steersman this season, they came in first. The Freshmen with your writer steering did not fare so well with a third place finish. When all the points were added up the day was ours with 39 points to Waikiki Surf Club at 31.




BY-LAWS AND INFORMATION BOOKLETS

Last month two useful booklets were mailed to all members of the club. One was the May 1967 reprint of the By-laws as last amended on February 24, 1967. The By-laws are the highest authority governing all of us, from the directors and officers down to the committees and members at large, therefore it is hoped that complete familiarization by the membership will soon result. Members will find that the very complete index will be of great help.

The second booklet entitled Membership Information is an up-dated reprint of the one which first appeared in January 1964 when the club moved into its new facilities. This booklet covers a multitude of subjects of general interest and is of value for that reason. Unfortunately, the reader is apt to be confused into believing that the first portion of the booklet constitutes the official rules and regulations of the club. This is not so. Members should be aware that the complete, official rules and regulations governing the membership are those which are posted at various places about the club premises. These rules consist of sections I to VIII, inclusive, adopted by the Board of Directors and dated January 1, 1964, and the recent addition of section IX relating to beach and water safety adopted by the Board on April 20, 1967. As with the By-laws, it is hoped that the members will familiarize themselves with the official rules as posted.

Many alert members have called attention to a number of sections of the information booklet which are contradictory not only to fact and other sections within the booklet itself but also to the By-laws and the official rules and regulations adopted by the Board. It is imperative that members note four of the more obvious

inaccuracies, as follows:

1. Guest Members are restricted to non-residents of Oahu. (One section of the information booklet states "non-residents of Hawaii").

2. There is a locker room for Junior girls as well as for boys. (The information booklet implies otherwise).

3. The information booklet unfortunately states that spouses of members and their children under age 10 are included in membership. This of course is erroneous since it contradicts the By-laws, which provide that children under age ten may be regularly admitted to the club when accompanied by an adult member, and that upon reaching age ten are eligible for junior membership. The By-laws also provide that spouses are eligible for associate membership. However, to those spouses who do not wish membership, the Board of Directors for many years has granted special guest privileges; and furthermore the By-laws exempt spouses from the twice-per-month limitation applicable to other guests. The By-laws also grant this exemption to dates or escorts of single members. Incidently, for those many spouses who have not yet availed themselves of the special guest privilege, cards signifying same may be obtained from the manager. A spouse holding the special guest card is permitted to use certain club facilities, purchase food and beverages and charge same to the member, and bring guests.

4. The information booklet purports to quote the first subsection of Section 21 of the By-laws entitled **General Admission of Members.** The last paragraph purporting to restrict sponsorship of membership applications to Regular members who have been in good standing for one year is inadvertently included. This provision is merely a recommendation by the Board of Directors and will undoubtedly be presented to the voting members at the next annual meeting. Until that time, of course, **all voting** members (regular, honorary and life) except directors, officers and admissions committee members may sponsor membership applications.
