



REGATTA SEASON Ends With Fifth Place Finish


Outrigger Canoe Club's men's upper division crews dominated the Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association Championship Regatta August 1 at Hilo Bay, winning the Freshmen, Sophomore, Senior, and Masters 40, 50 and 55 races.

OCC finished the regatta with 272 points for fifth place behind Hawaiian Canoe Club of Maui with 355 points, Kai Opua of Kona with 295, Kailua Canoe Club with 293 and Lanikai Canoe Club with 273.

A second place finish was turned in by the Masters Men 60 who had gone undefeated during the Oahu regattas.


Third place medals went to the Boys 15 and 18 crews, the Sophomore and Senior Women and the Junior Men.

With the regatta season behind them, paddlers have now moved into the distance season, with the Na Wahine O Ke Kai Molokai to Oahu Race scheduled for September 27 and the Molokai Hoe Race on October 11.





Review #50 features The Southport Yacht Club, Australia

Founded in 1946 The Southport Yacht Club is the newest addition to our reciprocal list. For 63 years, this club sitting on Australia's popular Gold Coast's, main purpose has been to provide excellent facilities for those interested in water sports of all types.

Of special interest to many OCC members would be their outrigger canoe division. On their website they refer to such activity as "Outrigging". They have full on divisions and regattas just the same as we do here. In 2008 their women's team won first place in every OC6 open race at Hamilton Island.

The club is a major player in Australia and International yachting circles, and provides a large marina which recently underwent a renovation increasing the capacity to over 300 berths. The club has a sailing squadron in another location and a retreat called Dux, which is very popular as a weekend escape.

The club is also well known in the community for its exceptional waterfront dining experience. This area too underwent an extreme upgrade in late 2008 which involved tearing down part of the clubhouse and rebuilding. The Waterfront Restaurant in the Main Beach Clubhouse was part of this upgrade and boasts exceptional views from both the deck and the interior.

They're open for dinner seven nights a week, and for lunch Monday-Saturday from noon-2:30 p.m. and on Sunday until 3 p.m. The main bar is open seven days a week from 10 a.m. until late and there's live entertainment on weekends.

The Sailing Squadron's bar is open Wednesday-Sunday, and the Cellar is open seven days a week for take away convenience. The Compass Room is available for private parties as are other function rooms.

The dress code had a few details, but basically similar to OCC. Casual elegance in the dining areas - they refer to it as neat and tidy - no shorts upstairs - however they can be worn downstairs, but only with shoes. No hats are permitted in the club at any time. More details on the dress code and other interesting items can be found on their website at www.south-portyachtclub/au.

This is a club where our members will feel very comfortable with all the water connections.

Their members will also find OCC a welcome place for them to visit. Possibly some of our paddlers have been there already and vice versa. Do make it a point the next time you're in that area of the world to pay Southport Yacht Club a visit. Stop by, have a relaxing drink and meal, and enjoy the view and hospitality.

Backward Glances

66 Years Ago 1943

Remembrances from the Oral History of Thomas W. G. Singlehurst light up fascinating moments in OCC's history. Have you wondered sometimes who was Club Member Number One? It was Singlehurst. "Sometimes, I've been out there to eat and I said "One" they hardly believed what I was talking about."

During the years of WW II, he spoke of Admiral 'Bull' Halsey: "During the war years I went [to the Club] a great deal. In fact I did quite a bit of Navy 'brass' entertaining at that time. Because I used to steer canoes then, I'd take them to lunch and then take them out and catch a few waves. It was a great way to entertain. Well, that place was humming from about 11 o'clock in the morning until 12 o'clock at night. And there were times when Bull Halsey would tell [Club manager] Mr. Degora, 'I don't want anyone else-the Navy is taking over the Club tonight'. And he would take it over and nobody else could go there....


"They had all kinds of notables in the Club at that time.

As a matter of fact we were afraid that the military was going to take it over. But they never did and it meant a great deal of money to the Club because they were spending money-you know how it was-the military, men and women both spent money like water down there." The Club then paid off a bond issue and current bills. Said Singlehurst: "And as I said we ended up with \$150,000 in the bank."

"I acted as president because during the war many of the others would be gone. But some years later the Board of Directors decided they only wanted presidents pictures hung up there so my picture is in my office... I am mentioned in the Outrigger book prepared by Harold Yost."

A heavy silver plate once presided over Singlehurst's office desk. It read, "Distinguished Service, Tom "Beans" Singlehurst, Director, Secretary, Treasurer, 1930 – 1948, Outrigger Canoe Club." Said Singlehurst: "That was presented to me at a small gathering of the directors at the Club one night...They gave this to me, as you read, in honor and because of the service I had rendered to the Club.

"The Forecast wrote a history of what I had done for the Club. This I hold with a great deal of esteem. I'm so pleased to have had it."

BOARD BRIEFS

Board Briefs is taken from the minutes of the Board of Directors meeting on July 30, 2009.

2009 Budget Committee: In accordance with BOD policy 3.3, Brad Wagenaar, Treasurer, will chair this committee. The members shall consist of the Executive Committee, the CDs of the Buildings and Grounds, House and Finance and/or Long Range Planning Committees and others as may be appointed by the President. The General Manager and Controller will be ex-officio members.

Membership Count: The Membership Count was 4,803 as of June 30, 2009.

Admissions Ad Hoc: Certain membership categories have quotas that are hard and fast. If exceeded, no candidates are admitted. Other categories have suggested guidelines regarding the number of members in each category. However, the count can be exceeded and a candidate admitted. At the admission point for Associate (except Associate Spouse), the quota has been over the stated number and no new applicants have been admitted in almost a year. In order to increase flexibility between categories, this committee recommended and the Board approved the following changes to Membership Quotas and Guidelines:

Quotas: Hard and fast. If exceeded, no candidates are admitted until spaces open up.

 Core (Intermediate, Regular, Senior, Life): 1,925 to 1,930.

- Associate (excluding Associate Spouse): 165 to 400.
- Juniors (Parent Nonmember): 175.
- * Nonresident (Pure): 320.

Manager's Report: Financially, June was another good month. Net income from operations was \$39,755 above budget. Year to date, \$428,750 in initiation fees were collected and deposited in the Capital Improvement Fund. Year to date, there is a Building Fund income of \$121,625. Dues and other income less expenses were \$40,396 which is \$51,596 better than budget. Logo Shop was (\$2,160) below budget. For June, there was combined Food and Beverage income (with the mini-charge) of \$59,315 which is \$35,815 better than budget.

Unrelated Business Income: Year to date, nonmember income is at 13.1% which is down from 13.3% this time last year.

Buildings & Grounds: Kyle Pang and Dwight Kawata of *P3 Management LLC* were chosen as construction managers for the plumbing/locker room project. . . The committee is deferring any further action on seawall encroachment project until the bid for the plumbing and locker room renovation bids are reviewed and the first phase of the project is completed.


