


Regatta Season Underway; Macfarlane Regatta on 4th of July

Outrigger Canoe Club paddlers kicked off the 2010 Oahu Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association regatta season on June 6, with a third place finish in the Clement Paiaina Regatta at Keehi Lagoon. On June 12, the Club paddlers also finished in third place at the Kamehameha Day Regatta at Kailua Beach Park.

The Boys and Girls 12 crews started the Paiaina Regatta with a bang with victories in their quarter-mile races. They were followed later in the day with victories by the Freshmen Women, Sophomore Men and Masters Men 55.

A total of 274 paddlers were signed up on opening day, with more paddlers still registering. We still need paddlers to fill certain crews so fill out a form and join us.

If you're new to canoe racing, you'd be amazed at all that goes on before the paddlers ever get to the beach on race day. In the week before the race, late registrations have to be processed at OHCRA so that paddlers can paddle. Thanks Alice Lunt. On Wednesdays, the Club must be present at lane drawing at Radford High School. Thanks Kehau Kali and Kawika Grant and others.

Of course there's practice either at the Ala Wai, in the ocean or in the trainer. Thanks Coaches: Alan Pflueger, Mark Sandvold, Kulani Jones, Willy Gacutan, Karl Heyer IV, Jim Beaton, Casey Kahikina, Chris and Genie Kincaid, Liz Perry, John Puakea, and Tom McTigue. And thanks parents who get your paddler to practice on time.

On Saturday, the day before race day, paddlers have to load up the Club truck with the tent, tables, chairs and all the other things that are needed on race day. The racing canoes also need to be loaded onto the trailer. Thanks to the upper division crews. Oops don't forget the rigging.

Early Sunday morning (try 5 a.m.) volunteers arrive at the

Club to drive the Club truck and canoes to the race site. Thanks Jared Watumull and others. Meanwhile, other volunteers arrive at the beach to set up the tent, and rig the canoes. Before 8 a.m. our Club rep has to attend the OHCRA coaches meeting and turn in the day's line ups.

And then the racing can begin. Oops there might be changes to the line ups as paddlers call in sick or just don't show. Thanks Alice for all those trips back and forth to the official's stand. And thanks to the water men and women who hold boats for the start of each race.

And then after the last race of the day when you think it's all over, crews need to take down the tent, load the truck, unrig the canoes and take everything back to the Club where things are unloaded and stored for next week, and the prized koa canoes cleaned and stored.

Many thanks to the Canoe Racing Committee chaired by Stew Kawakami for their tireless efforts in doing all the behind-the-scenes tasks that make canoe racing possible. Members of the committee are Alice Lunt, Julia Fiedler, Jen Bossert, Mike Kane and Jared Watumull. Thanks to all the others who haven't been named who assist the coaches and the CRC during regatta season. We couldn't do it without all of you.

This month we celebrate the 4th of July with the Walter J. Macfarlane Regatta at Waikiki Beach. This race is hosted by OCC and this year is the 68th annual race. Join us at the Club afterward for the annual Club party.

Keanuenue Rochlen 1928 - 2010

We Miss You Keanuenue

The Club has dedicated this season to beloved paddler and steerswoman Keanuenue Rochlen who passed away in January. Keanuenue started paddling in the early 1940's with Blue Makua at the Waikiki Surf Club. She joined OCC in 1955 and steered our women's crews over a career spanning six decades.

She won more gold medals for paddling than any other female paddler in the state. During the 2000 paddling season Keanuenue was recognized as being the oldest registered woman paddler in OHCRA. And her career went on for another nine years.

From 1983 through 1989, the Outrigger Master's Women steered by Keanuenue won seven consecutive Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association State Championships. During these same years Rochlen also steered her crew to 17 consecutive first places. Last year at age 81, she steered the Women 55 to an 11th place finish in States in a field of 14.

Keanuenue also competed on the Club's volleyball, baseball and tennis teams. She swam at the Club daily and was a strong athlete. She was elected to the Winged "O" in 2005 and named the Club's Most Valuable Paddler. She was felled by a stroke in December 2009 and passed away one day shy of her 82nd birthday.

This year's paddling T-shirt has a paddle design across the front of the shirt and Keanuenue's name. She was appreciated by her teammates for her knowledge of the water, no nonsense role as a steerswoman and leader, and her sense of humor. She was a role model for younger paddlers for her knowledge, strength and endurance.



The Annual OCC Invitational swim was remarkable for the large increase in participation and challenging conditions. Unlike the obvious high surf conditions at last year's Invitational Swim, the conditions for this year's event appeared (from the beach) to be favorable. As the swimmers learned shortly into the race, the ocean can be deceiving.

The swim actually is two races. A one-mile swim that goes straight out and back in front of the Club and a two mile swim that takes the swimmers straight out and then down to Waikiki towards the Royal Hawaiian. For the first time, the one mile race was open to all age groups and the two mile swim was an open event with no age groups.

The two milers started first from Kaimana Beach. Included in the field was last year's Castle Swim champion, Ryan Saunders, UH stand out Steve Allnut, last year's winner Ryan Leong and world class open water swimmer, Noa Sakamoto. The women's field was equally packed with talent including former double Roughwater champions Gail Grabowsky and Kathryn Taylor.

It was apparent from the start that waves and currents would play an important part in the race. After the first turn, the main field broke into several small packs. As the groups rounded the half way buoy, it became apparent that everyone had a different idea of the best line home. Ultimately, Allnutt made the right decision as he put nearly seven minutes between himself and runner up Noa Sakamoto. Right behind the lead men were Grabowsky and Miki David.

The first OCC finishers for the two mile race were Ryan Saunders for the men and Kelsey Chuckovich for the women

The one mile race did not involve the same navigation skills, but it was equally impacted by the ocean conditions. The first swimmer overall was UH swim coach Leane Darling. She finished about 30 seconds ahead of the first male finisher, Ernie James. The first

OCC members to finish were Ingrid Rolles and Dave Rietow.

As with almost any event held at the Club, the real highlight of the day was the Sunday Brunch. The post race air was filled with a sense of accomplishment and camaraderie. It was plain to the Swim Committee volunteers that the race was another success.

Participation in the Invitational Swim is limited to members of swim and triathlon clubs. This year 126 swimmers started the race. This number was up by 42 swimmers from 2009 and 61 from 2008. Clearly, we are trending in the right direction. The Swim Committee expects that in 2011 we will reach our maximum of 150 swimmers.

Next up is the Annual Castle swim. The event is traditionally held on the Sunday following Thanksgiving. It is open to Club members only. The course remains the same each year and participants are able to have personal escorts. While there is a race element to the event, it is also an opportunity to simply enjoy a swim with friends, see the sights off of Waikiki, and enjoy the fabulous OCC brunch on the beach. Please mark the event on your Calendar and plan to participate.





Tahiti Visits OCC Luau



Backward Glances

95 Years Ago 1915 Guy H. Tuttle, President

After a fire that destroyed part of the Outrigger's facilities, a party took place on August 18, 1915, to celebrate the newly built clubhouse. A newspaper article reported that: "For nearly four hours, the cooks of the Women's Auxiliary, aided by perhaps 40 others who served, dished up chowder, coffee, rolls, cakes, pineapple, and other delectable comestibles to the hungry, well-dressed throng of merrymakers."

90 Years Ago 1920 Peter Warren Dease, President

Seven Outrigger members participated in the 1920 Olympics in Antwerp, Belgium: Ludy Langer, Helen Moses, Duke Kahanamoku, Warren Kealoha, Pua Kealoha, Bill Harris, and coach "Dad" Center.

85 Years Ago 1925

Joseph Rider Farrington, President

One of the most coveted volleyball titles was that of Outrigger Doubles Champions. At a Club tournament first held in 1925, "Dad" Center and Sam Fuller took the honors; the tournament is still an annual event.

70 Years Ago 1940 James Walter Macfarlane, President

After raising nearly \$50,000, contracts with architect and contractor were signed on June 25, 1940, and work on the new club at Waikiki began shortly after. Existing buildings were razed and construction began on three new structures, including a waterfront clubhouse with a glass-enclosed lounge and sundeck, ground floor cocktail lounge, lanai cafe, hau terrace, grill and soda fountain. Including locker rooms with steel lockers and showers, the project cost approximately \$75,000.



BOARD BRIEFS

Board Briefs is taken from the minutes of the May 27, 2010 meeting of the Board of Directors.

Membership Count: The Membership Count was 4,781 as of April 30, 2010.

Admissions Report: The membership of John Puakea was transferred from Special to Regular.

Historical Report: This committee is addressing (long term) the disposition of the Club's trophies. There are three award bowls and a framed, signed 1982 Honolulu Marathon Poster that have some historical significance. A decision regarding their disposition was determined by the committee: Samuel Fuller Award to winners of the Macfarlane Senior 6 women (circa 1950s): Fuller family members; Wilford Godbold Award to winners of the Macfarlane Senior 4 men (specific race no longer run) (circa 1950s): Remain at OCC; HCRA George Murphy Award: Murphy family members; Framed, signed 1982 Honolulu Marathon Poster: Remain at OCC. The Board approved the committee's recommendation.

Honorary Membership: Gordon Smith, who served as the Club's Controller and Acting General Manager until he retired May 31 after completing 25 years of service, was granted an Honorary membership.

Financial Statement: For April, there was Net Income from Clubhouse Operations of \$3,609 which is \$6,109 less than budget. Year to date, there is net income of \$67,939 which is \$28,061 better than budget. Year to date, \$261,700 in initiation fees were collected and deposited in the Capital Improvement Fund. For April, there was a combined Food & Beverage net income (with the minicharge) of \$76 which is \$13,624 below budget.

Projects in Progress: Phase 2 of our Sewer Rehabilitation work will include the back of house plumbing infrastructure (laundry, employee locker rooms, storeroom, etc.) to begin in September. After canoe long distance season is over (mid-October), work in Canoe Alley followed by the Snack Shop will take place. New drain lines under the Snack Shop will be installed and will run through canoe alley to a new, larger grease interceptor fronting the canoe alley gate. During construction, there will be periods of closure for canoe alley and the Snack Shop. Whether the closure is in phases or at one time has not yet been determined. The permitting process should


begin by the end of this month.

Unrelated Business Income: Year to date, non-member income is at 14% compared to 13.3% this time last year. Ad revenues are \$9,571 better than last year.

Ka Mo'i Canoe: Concerns about safety and liability from members/guests climbing into the Ka Mo'i canoe suspended above the bar were discussed. The motion was made, seconded and approved that member(s) who climb in the Ka Mo'i canoe will be subject to disciplinary actions up to and including termination of membership.

Parking Decals: Many members are entering the parking garage without an OCC decal on their vehicle. Many of these members have been reminded by the parking attendant that, by Club policy, a decal is needed and they have been ignored. Discussion followed and the following policies were adopted:

- Voting members may have up to two decals regardless of their marital status.
- Vehicle registration/ownership document is required for assignment of a decal at the Front Desk.
- Members will be charged \$5.00 per visit to park their vehicle in the parking garage if their vehicle does not have a current OCC decal.
- All employees must park on the top two levels except Executive Management (General Manager, Executive Chef, F & B Director and Controller) who may park in the basement levels.


