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# Outrigger to Host 62nd Annual Walter J. MacFarlane Regatta July 4

Outrigger Canoe Club will host the Oahu Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association's only wave regatta, Sunday, July 4, at Waikiki Beach. The Walter J. Macfarlane Regatta is the longest running canoe race in the world. The event is named after the late OCC president Walter J. Macfarlane, and has been held continuously since 1943.

Races in the 37 events for ages 12 to 55+ get underway at 8:30 a.m. and wind up with trophy presentations at Duke's after the last event around 4 p.m. All members are invited to cheer the paddlers on at the Club tent in front of the Outrigger hotel.

Following the race, Outrigger paddlers and their families and guests will head back to the Club for the annual 4th of July BBQ and celebration.

The OHCRA regatta season opened at Keehi Lagoon on June 6 with the Clement D. Paiaina Regatta sponsored by Healani Canoe Club. It was a day that changed from sunny to drizzle and back to sunny and windy many times. The weather didn't stop anybody as 16 canoe clubs competed in the regatta.

Outrigger registered nearly 300 paddlers for regatta season, and fielded crews in all but three events at the Paiaina Regatta, the Girls 13, Boys 16 and Novice B Women.

OCC finished fifth in the regatta, scoring 40 points. Kailua and Hui Lanakila tied for first place with 74 points.






# Requesting A Few Good Reciprocal Clubs


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

Designing a menu is a difficult proposition at any time but at the Outrigger Canoe Club it's darn nigh impossible. Everyone has their favorites; many items are sacred and therefore cannot be touched. I can ask one table of diners what they would like to see in a new menu and get a set of answers and then turn to another table and get an opposite view.

An idea developed as an offshoot of this menu process as we will be featuring different buffets revolving around various culinary themes. We will explore the tastes of Italy, the Mediterranean, Mexico, the Far East and the Local Kine.

We wish to provide affordable buffets with beverage specials. We think these buffet nights are destined to become Club favorites!

Once the dust settles we will be tackling the dinner menus in the Hau Terrace and the Koa Lanai and I am confident that the process will be as painful as the design of the lunch menu but just as tasty and satisfying when complete.

# OCC Invitational Swim Filmed by BBC

A shock was experienced by 73 of Oahu's top swimmers (from most of Oahu's swim clubs) on May 2, when they gathered on the San Souci beach to compete in the OCC Annual Invitational 1-mile and 2-mile Swim. Right before the starting signal, meet director Dennis Blake announced that the film crew in their midst was the British Broadcasting Corp's crew filming the event for a program on sharks!

There was lots of nervous laughter, and bang, the swimmers hit the water.

Only after the event was over did contestants learn that the BBC's Natural History Division was filming the OCC event for the Discovery Channel's week-long series on sharks which aired in June. The OCC segment was filmed to illustrate there is safe, successful recreational use of the oceans of the world, in spite of the fact that sharks are known to be in the water.

The BBC crew wasn't hoping for a shark attack to occur. The pre-race announcement may have helped the swimmers come in faster.

The winners in the 1-mile swim were Roger Cundall (26:29) and Betty Ann Sallee (28:21). The fastest in the 2-mile swim were Ben Komer (55:24) and Nicole Hagi (1:00:45).

Surveying the ocean from the beach 30 minutes prior to race start, Blake judged the water to be "great, a great day for swimming." Roger Cundall immediately replied "yesterday would have been better! It's beginning to kick up out there now."

By the time the race was over, most swimmers agreed with Cundall. A strong Ewa-to-Diamond Head current developed, and more than one swimmer opted midcourse for the shorter swim. Ernie Leskovitz and several others vowed the swim was tougher than the last Roughwater Swim.

No matter what the latest diet buzz, new Food and Beverage Director Daryll Hersche is ready to deliver. A low carb beer is already available, and the lunch and dinner menus soon will feature "healthy alternatives" selections.

But those still enthralled with bread need not despair. Hersche is quick to point out that an infusion of fresh ideas doesn't mean that people will lose their old-time favorites.

Without touching the staples, he's already implemented a Wine of the Month program, featuring unlisted selections paired with a special entrée. Hersche says he scouts "wines of the future," little-known labels not yet found in grocery stores. A "Captain's List" with limited specialty wines will soon be part of a revamped menu. Organically grown wine is another potential addition.

In his quest for fresh activities revolving around dining and imbibing, he wants to incorporate more wine tastings, as well as a Pacific Oktoberfest with beers from around the world.

His experience has taught him what's needed at every level of the restaurant business. Hersche came to the Outrigger Canoe Club from the Biltmore Hotel in downtown Los Angeles, where he served as Director of Food and Beverage for 18 months. Before that, his impressive career as an executive chef took him around the globe to Canada, Israel, Switzerland, and all over the United States, including Hawaii twice, before his most recent arrival.

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



ters and cards that I have received over the past year. You just can't imagine how much these expressions of kindness and good wishes mean to me.

I am still waiting for that matching liver. At present I'm listed at UC Irvine, UC Davis and soon to be at Scripps in San Diego. California is in a liver crisis.

As you might guess I had every test known to man, not to mention that I had to have a four-way heart bypass just to get into the program. The disease that I have is named primary sclerosing cholangitis, the same liver bile duct disease that took football great Walter Payton. It is a rare disease with very few cases in Irvine, Orange County, California where I am now living.

It seems like just yesterday that I was walking through the Club and sharing the stories of members and your accomplishments. I miss everyone a lot, but hope that I will be back home soon to visit with all of you. Right now, though I need to stay close to the medical facilities in California, which is the only state where my insurance will cover.

You know I'm a fighter. Each day I ready myself to take the fight on. I continue to pump the bile out of my stomach each day and that keeps me alive and feeling better. My bags are packed awaiting the doctor's call. I try to keep my attitude positive in spite of the setbacks.

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


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### 54 Years Ago 1950 Wilford D. Godbold, President

Canoe racing fans were surprised over the Outrigger's upset victory over the Waikiki Surf Club to retain the OCRC championship.





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
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### TWO MORE REGATTA CHAMPIONSHIPS



### **Board Briefs**

Board Briefs is taken from the minutes of the Board of Directors meeting on May 27, 2004. The May 19, 2004 Executive Committee meeting was cancelled.

Vice President Operations: Walter Guild is the chairman of the OCC2C Committee and Don Parker is the Liaison/Coordinating Director. During the OCC2C meeting on May 25, 2004, the committee reviewed SK-7 Plans with Management and Al Serafin, OCC Logo Shop Representative. The Committee worked on fine tuning the Fitness Center, back of the house, requirements for Administrative Offices, and Food and Beverage Offices/Storage. They also considered Logo Shop square footage and the addition of fitting rooms and storage areas. There is approximately \$28,000 remaining in the OCC-2C budget.

General Manager Report: There was net income of \$18,139 for April 2004. . . The volleyball court waterproofing project may be completed by July 4, 2004. . . The Elk's Club will be asked for their approval in order to begin the Wave Deflector Project. . . The Club cannot get insurance coverage for Surfing/Paddleboard events. The GM asked the Board if they would allow the surfing events to continue for members only with the liability indemnification clause waiver. The Board approved the use of an indemnification clause waiver for "members only" surfing event. The Club will attempt to secure insurance coverage for the paddleboard races or confirm that it is not available.

Admissions & Membership Report: The membership count was 4,688 as of April 30, 2004. . . Forty or more Regular Candidates will be interviewed and processed each year by the Admissions and Membership Committee.

House Report: The House Committee decided not to recommend the Fisher Island Club in Miami, Florida and the Jericho Tennis Club in Vancouver BC for reciprocity. The House Committee is researching new reciprocal clubs in London and Europe.

Long Range Planning Report: The Board approved the 2005 Budget Committee Members: Wendell Brooks Jr., Chair; Jaren Hancock, Alan Lau, Gregg Robertson, Susan Merrill, Bradley Wagenaar, Vik Watumull, Bill Comstock and Gordon Smith. The Board recommended that the Budget Committee add the House Committee Chair, Tom McTigue, and the Executive Committee consisting of Sue Tetmeyer, William Swope, and Barbara Stehouwer. Mr. Hancock will make these recommended additions to Chairman Brooks.
