Outrigger Celebrates

Outrigger Canoe Club paddlers won their second straight Oahu Hawaiian Canoe Racing Regatta championship on the 4th of July, capturing the 60th annual Walter J. Macfarlane Regatta at Waikiki Beach with a 16 point victory over second

place Lanikai.

The day started slowly and wound up with a bang as OCC won 10 of the last 18 events, including the women's freshmen, sophomore and senior races, the masters women 35, 45 and 55, the masters men 35 and 55, and the mixed open. Outrigger amassed 88 points, to Lanikai's 72, Hui Nalu's 50, Healani's 44, Hui Lanakila's 37 and Kailua's 35 in the AA division for larger clubs.

The Macfarlane Regatta is the only wave race on the OHCRA schedule, and features the skill of the various clubs'

steersmen and women.

With flat surf and only a few bumps, OCC's steersmen and women were challenged. In the age group events early in the day, it didn't seem to matter what lane Outrigger was in, the bumps were always several lanes away. However, luck changed as the day wore on, and the home club advantage paid off.

In total Outrigger won 12 events, finished second six times, third four times, and fourth twice. The Boys 15 and 16

crews started the Club off on its winning ways.

Race announcer extra ordinaire Mike Buck was behind the microphone all day announcing the results of the various events, and keeping the Macfarlane trivia alive. This was the 25th year that Mike has been the announcer at the Macfarlane

Regatta.

Thanks also goes to Scrappy Lipton who works hard every

year in making arrangements for the Waikiki event.

Many members of the Macfarlane family were on hand at the awards ceremony at Duke's after the regatta to honor the winners. Walter Guild, grand nephew of Walter Macfarlane, poured champagne for the winning Senior Men and Women, which were Healani and Outrigger, respectively.

Following the ceremony, paddlers and their families regrouped at the Club for the 4th of July BBQ, entertainment

and dancing.

The Hawaiian Canoe Racing Association State Championships are scheduled for August 3 in Hilo Bay.



Master Plan Update

Nearly four years ago the Master Plan Committee was formed to identify the needs of the membership as we progress into the 21st century and determine how to best update our facilities to meet those needs.

The committee is dedicated to preserving the architectural design and integrity of our building and grounds and to ensure that all changes are consistent with the overall mission and traditions of the Outrigger Canoe Club.

The committee looked at the results of surveys taken in 1999 and 2001. They gathered input from standing committees and interested members and considered membership and economic trends. Although surveys show that the majority of members are happy with our current facilities, the committee found that the area members would like most to see improved is the Fitness Center.

The Board of Directors engaged architect Ted Garduque to work with the Master Plan Committee to advise it on design issues and draw up plans for the proposed changes. Several plans have been considered. Some involved dramatic changes such as excavating the sunken garden area on the Kalakaua Avenue side of the Club and building a Fitness Center there, or building a Fitness Center where the volleyball courts are currently located and raising the volleyball courts above the Fitness Center.

On June 14, 2002 the Master Plan Committee held a meeting and invited all members. At that meeting Committee Chairman Jaren Hancock and Architect Garduque reviewed plans that have been considered over the years.

They discussed the most recent proposal that would place the Fitness Center in the area now occupied by the "baby" volleyball court and extend it out over the roof of the Snack Shop.

This plan, though more modest in scope and less expensive than earlier plans, was controversial. While some members at the meeting voiced strong support for the Fitness Center, other members expressed serious concerns about the possible loss of the "baby" volleyball court and the impact of a roof on the Snack Shop.

Based on input from the June 14 meeting, the Master Plan Committee is pushing forward to come up with a plan that is attractive to our diverse membership, economically viable, and acceptable to permitting authorities and our neighbors. The challenges are tremendous and the options limited.

By the time this magazine goes to press the committee will have held a full day session where they will consider proposals made during and after the June 14 meeting, review the strengths and weaknesses of previous proposals, and devise a framework for a plan to bring before the Board.

In addition to Chairman Hancock, members of the Master Plan Committee are John Marshall, Glenn Perry, William Swope, Sue Tetmeyer, Barbara Stehouwer, Alan Lau, Tom Fee, Bob Dewitz, Joyce Timpson, Gloria Keller, Don Parker and John Rader.

They will try to keep members up-to-date on the committee's progress via this magazine and the web-site. They cannot guarantee that they will be able to respond to every comment and suggestion, but members are welcome to make them (preferably in writing) to any committee member. All suggestions will be considered if it is feasible to do so during the design phase in which they are received.

New Postage Stamp Honors Duke



On August 24, the life and legacy of Duke Paoa Kahanamoku will be celebrated by the U.S. Postal Service and the people of Hawaii with a commemorative postage stamp in his honor. Outrigger members are invited to join the celebration.

The stamp, depicting a handsome young Duke with Waikiki Beach and Diamond Head in the back-

drop, will be unveiled in an inspiring, spiritually moving ceremony on the 112th anniversary of Duke's birthday.

Fittingly, Duke's commemorative stamp will be introduced near his family's home, the Kalia section of Waikiki Beach that now fronts the Hilton Hawaiian Village Beach Resort and Spa.

At about 1:30 p.m., the famed Polynesian voyaging vessel, *Hokulea*, will bring the stamp's welcoming delegation into Kalia Bay, including U.S. Senator Daniel Akaka, Chairman Robert Rider of the U.S. Postal Services' Board of Governors, a representative from the Outrigger Duke Kahanamoku Foundation, and a member of the Kahanamoku family.

The Polynesian voyaging vessels Makalii and Hawaii Loa will be moored in the bay awaiting their arrival, joined by an expected large contingent of surfers and canoe paddlers paying tribute to Duke's memory.

A shore side ceremony will follow to dedicate the stamp. Afterwards, Duke stamps will be available for purchase from the U.S. Postal Service inside Hilton's beachfront Tropics Cafe. Stamp collectors may also obtain a first day of issue cancellation.

That evening, beginning at 6 p.m., a luau presented by the Native Hawaiian Hospitality Association, will be held on the lawn fronting the Hilton Lagoon featuring entertainment by special guests. Tickets for the Luau may be purchased for \$90 by calling Aloha Festivals at 589-1771. Proceeds from the Luau will go to the Outrigger Duke Kahanamoku Foundation and the NHHA.

The tentative list of entertainers for the luau are Don Ho, Myrtle K. Hilo, Mahi Beamer, Melveen Leed, Nina Kealiiwahamana, Reign, Les Ceballos, Aaron Sala, Tihati DFS. The masters of ceremonies will be Kimo Kahoano and Cha Thompson.


The Duke's commemorative stamp will be the centerpiece of a month-long calendar of water sports activities and host of special events celebrating his life and achievements.

A full-blooded Hawaiian and descendant of Hawaiian royalty, Duke first emerged on the world stage at the 1912 Stockholm Olympics, winning a gold medal for the U.S. in the 100-meter freestyle swim in record-setting time. He competed in four Olympic Games over two decades, winning three gold and two silver medals in swimming, and a bronze medal in water polo.

Revered world-wide as the "Father of International Surfing," Duke introduced the sport to the U.S. eastern seaboard, Europe and Australia. His accomplishments compelled Surfer magazine to declare Duke as the "Surfer of the Century". In addition, Sports Illustrated magazine proclaimed him as Hawaii's greatest athlete of the 20th century.

Duke's remarkable exploits, striking good looks, powerful physique, and natural grace captivated the world's attention and established him as a global icon. He epitomized Hawaii's appeal. Presidents, kings and queens, movie celebrities, and superstar athletes sought him out. They were awed by his presence; he charmed them as few could.

Duke Paoa Kahanamoku was a water sports legend that Hawaii proudly shared with the rest of the world. On August 24, the U.S. Postal Service and Hawaii's people will put a stamp on the legacy of his incredible life.

Other age group competitors from the Club fared well including the intrepid Jim Stahl, who turns out each year for the event, taking a third place in his age group. Shawn Kiyabu took fifth place overall. Arnold Lum took first place in his age group. In the next age

category, Outrigger members swept all the awards taking first, second, and third with Peter Caldwell, Frederick Giles, and Jim Stahl respectively.

Candes Gentry took fourth place. Karen Sundstrom finished in second place in her age group, Laurie Sloan took a first place and Barbie Dial-Crandlemire came in third. Jan Newhart took first place in her category.



Backward Glances

54 Years Ago 1948 Wilford D. Godbold, President

The monthly cost of operating the OCC parking lot was \$600. Parking privileges were not automatic with Club membership and members who desired to use the lot without restrictions paid \$2 a month. Other members were allowed to park at 25-cents for the first two hours and 10-cents each additional hour. However, restrictions did apply on Saturday afternoons and Territorial holidays.

44 Years Ago 1958 Ronald Q. Smith, President

The Board of Directors instructed Val Ossipoff, architect for the new Club, to discontinue design work for the time being. The Board wanted to firm up beach planning at the Elks Club site before proceeding further.

The Club offered for sale six outrigger canoes at \$200 each or would consider a "reasonable offer."

Gay Singlehurst presented her fall fashion forecast: one piece wool knit suits, chemised and fitted alike. Out, two-piece suits. In, long tapered pants or capris topped off either by a brief over blouse or a longer one coming down to fit snugly at the hip. For dressier activities, the "vamp look," one unbroken line of dress, sometimes ending in a flounce just above the knee.

The chemise is in to stay, the sack is out along with the trapeze.

The new look — shorter hemline for a long, leggy look!!

OCC paddlers won the Territorial Canoe Racing Championship at Nawiliwili Harbor, Kauai. The 10-event program honored John D. Kaupiko Sr., a veteran Hui Nalu coach. OCC placed first in four events and also finished in second place four times. Two other Club canoes finished in third place in their respective events.

Because of new surfing regulations by the Territory and the possible liability which may accrue to the Club through the use of its canoes, the Canoe Committee requested all who considered themselves qualified steersman to submit their names together with the extent of their qualifications. Information was to include size of canoe, size of surf (e.g. "blowhole," canoe surf," etc.) in which steersman consider they have "full control" of the canoe. Names submitted were to be reviewed for certification.

34 Years Ago 1968 Howard H. Goss, President

August 3 Healani was the victor in the State Championship Regatta held at the Kaneohe Marine Air Station and Outrigger took second place. Outrigger had an impressive and undisputable racing season as overall champion with 174 points, Waikiki Surf Club with

159 points and Healani with 114.

The Third Annual Outrigger Canoe Club Surfing Contest was held August 17 at "Old Man's." Seventy Club members signed up for the events that were held in 3 to 5-foot waves under choice conditions. Judges were Wally Froiseth, Russ Tahaki and Ken Bailey. The feature event was the Senior Men's won by defending champion Fred Hemmings with Rick Steere and Peter Balding tied for second. Rusty Starr won the Junior's over Russell Brown. Wahine finals saw Koochie Rochlen topping Sharon Ackerman and Phyllis Swartz. Winner in the Boys 12-14 was Keone Downing and Wally Hawthorne, second. In the Boys and Girls 11 and under, held at "Backwash" surf next to the Elks Club, Marc Haine won with Peter

Balding and Julie Morgan making it close.

On August 24 at 8:35 a.m. the first annual Lanikai to Waikiki Canoe Race got underway as a tribute to Duke Kahanamoku. The 23-mile open sea race was around Makapuu Point, Koko Head to Waikiki finishing at the Moana Hotel. Ten teams (two from OCC) started and seven finished four hours later. Three canoes were forced out by rough seas and 20-knot winds. The OCC Seniors took an early lead and finished at 3:44.8. Second place was Lanikai Canoe Club; Waikiki Surf Club, third, followed by the OCC Juniors a spirited team who had maintained a solid lead all the way to Koko Head, at one point closing in to about 200 yards on our leading Seniors, until reluctantly having to yield to Lanikai and Waikiki Surf.

August 24 was also Club Day with a variety of activities for all ages with proceeds of the day going to the athletic fund. A new event was the father/son paddle board race over a set course in and out of the Club lagoon. Another first event was a two-man canoe relay race from the beach out to the channel entrance and back. The fun day ended with a \$5 steak fry with Happy Hour prices 6-8 p.m., for Senior members. Junior members had a special \$1.50 stew and rice dinner followed by surfing movies.

The Outrigger Skeet Team held their second annual shoot at Hickam Air Force Base. This was a mid-summer handicap shoot consisting of 50 targets. Taking the first spot away from the men was Suzanne Kumeiliki with an adjusted score of 47.50, Guy Harrison was second with 45.50 and Neal Wallace, third with 44.50.
