The Outrigger Canoe Club was formally organized May 1 at the Promotions Committee rooms (Visitors Bureau) and elected Alexander Hume Ford, president; H. L. S. Herbert, vice-president; Henry P. O'Sullivan, secretary; Richard H. Trent, treasurer; Kenny Winters, captain; Charles Russell Frazier, auditor; J. P. Clark, Harry Macfarlane Jr., and J. R. Galt, trustees. "Maintaining a spot on Waikiki Beach where surf-boards and canoe enthusiasts may keep their canoes

and surfboards, that the royal sport of surfing may be preserved in Hawaii. Annual Dues \$5.00 a year to actual surfers, men and boys. To those using the Club as a place to entertain visiting friends \$10."


